Introduction to Acting

The 2023-2024 **Introduction to Acting** program is designed to make the students aware of the many aspects of onstage and offstage production, specifically focusing on acting techniques, as well as, many of the technical aspects of production. The students acquire the basic knowledge and practical skills involved in producing live theatre performances based in historical and cultural context. They acquire abilities and confidence to perform with conviction before an audience, learning to evaluate others and self. In addition to acting skills and techniques, students are introduced to improvisation, pantomime, movement, script analyses and theatre terminology.

- III. Actor Exercise (physical and vocal) Close to Self
- IV. Improvisation and C.R.O.W. (Character / Relationship / Objective / Where)
- V. Pantomime
- VI. Emotional recall and personalization
- VII. Theatre History
- VIII. Original Writing and Performance
- IX. Monologue work
- X. Assigned Scene Work 2 and 3 person pieces

The selection of units depends upon class size, time availability, and student development. The units are to be used at teacher discretion, and may be combined to other units. Point value for work increases throughout the semester.

However, due to the performance/activity nature of the course, many performance activities and assignments can't be made up. Early departure from a class also counts as an absence. Please ensure that your parents schedule your appointments around your classes.

<u>Late Paper Policy</u>: No late papers will be accepted without previous consent of the instructor due to personal circumstances. I prefer to receive papers on the deadline, but if you would like to discuss an extension, arrangements must be made AHEAD of the deadline or the paper will not be accepted. During the week of any school production in which you are involved, you are allowed a one week extension on the assignment. <u>Please remind me before the deadline that it is your production week.</u>

<u>Communication:</u> Because this is a class that does not meet every day, it is important that you regularly communicate with me regarding any questions or concerns. If you do not understand an assignment, please contact me via email. I am certainly available to speak during Nutrition or Lunch. If there are any changes in the syllabus, I will inform you as soon as possible. Please be respectful of the instructor and of classmates: please respond to emails promptly.

Academic misconduct: including plagiarism and other forms of cheating, will not be tolerated. If you choose to plagiarize, I will report your actions to our academy authorities and you will receive a failing grade. Plagiarism may be grounds for being dismissed from our school.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS, CONTENT & EVALUATION BREAKDOWN

Class Participation Grade: (50%)

This course requires that you be an *active participant* during each class, whether as performer or audience member

Assorted Graded Performance Assignments: (40%)

Numerous formally graded group or individual assignments throughout the semester. Performance assignments will include group identification assignments, acting scenes, improvisation work, and other assorted assignments.

Actor's Journal: (10%)

A journal will be kept reflecting upon your ongoing acting work, including reflections about class, rehearsals, or other life experiences related to acting. This is an opportunity to hold a dialogue with the instructor, ask questions, and contemplate the daily successes and failures while studying acting.

Extra Credit:

Extra credit can be made available by submitting a reflection paper to the instructor detailing a specific performance or theatre festival the student attended. Assignment needs to be cleared with the instructor before submitting the assignment for credit.
