



*A large stage has been prepared at [the Shaboo Stage outdoor events center](#) in Willimantic, AC. It is a sunny spring day with clear skies, a bald eagle can be seen flying in the skies nearby. More press is present at this rally than Rep. Eddie's prior Marienville ATV rally kickoff. A large, green dot is present on the center of the expanded stage with a podium featuring the Eddie for Senate campaign logo on it. It is so great to see such a diverse audience here in Willimantic, a wonderful town in the quiet corner of Connecticut, my amazing home state before it became a part of the Atlantic Commonwealth. Y'all are a true reflection of what makes your community so great. Let me address something before my opponents try to craft their own commentary.
