Militarily, it remains strong, but diplomatically, morally, economically, and demographically, it confronts challenges that are likely to worsen unless a new political path is found. While no solution is risk-free and success cannot be guaranteed, a negotiated two-state agreement appears to offer the best available path to preserving Israel as a secure, Jewish, democratic, and internationally respected state... No one can predict the future. A negotiated two-state agreement may ultimately prove impossible. But absent a credible alternative, Israelis and Palestinians seem destined to continue an endless cycle of violence, fear, and mutual distrust. - Israel has repeatedly demonstrated extraordinary courage on the battlefield. Today, it also requires courage in diplomacy and statecraft. The absence of intent enables those defending themselves against genocide to be blamed for killing their attackers—precisely the obscene inversion the genocide scholars have achieved with Israel and Hamas. As Louis-Klein has observed, genocide has thus been deployed not to prevent atrocities but to authorize them. These genocide scholars have no more intellectual authority than a pack of snake-oil salesmen—in fact, rather less, since anyone can join the IAGS for a fee which can be as low as \$30 and with no background checks being made. Members include human-rights activists, students, policymakers, artists and Uncle Tom Cobbley and all. No media outlets that ran with the screaming "genocide scholars say Israel guilty of genocide" headlines bothered to check the credibility of these "leading scholars" and their claims. Vierzehn arabische Staaten dehnen sich über Gebiete von insgesamt elf Millionen Quadratkilometern aus. Das ist eine Fläche, die um eine Million Quadratkilometer größer ist als ganz Europa, die europäische Sowjetunion miteingeschlossen. Der Staat Israel war bis zum Sechstagekrieg 27.000 Quadratkilometer groß. Das sind zwei Tausendstel des enormen arabischen Raumes. Es bleiben immer noch 99,80% aller arabischen Gebiete in arabischem Besitz, von denen der größte Teil unbebaut ist. Die gängige Mythologie ist, Israel sei auf dem Boden eines arabischen Staates durch dessen gewaltsame Teilung entstanden. Aber nie gab es einen palästinensischen arabischen Staat. Palästina war, als die zionistische Besiedlung begann, eine Provinz des ottomanischen Reiches. Das bebaute Land wurde rechtlich erworben. Es war zum großen Teil türkisches Kronland, aus dem damals siebzig Prozent des Territoriums bestanden. - Der Wille zur Ausradierung Israels ist die Konstante der arabischen Politik. Es besteht keinerlei Grund, die Ernsthaftigkeit des tausendmal Proklamierten herunterzuspielen. Hier nur wenige repräsentative Äußerungen Nassers: "Unser Ziel ist die Schaffung eines vereinten und ununterbrochenen arabischen Raumes, in welchem Israel ausgemerzt sein wird". (Botschaft an die arabische Studentenversammlung, London, 15. Mai 1965) "Das nationale arabische Endziel ist die Ausrottung Israels". (Gemeinsames Kommuniqué mit dem Präsidenten des Irak, 25. Mai 1965) "Unser Ziel ist die Vernichtung des israelischen Staates". (Rede in Kairo, 18. November 1965) "Die Existenz Israels an sich ist Aggression." (Pressekonferenz Kairo, 28. Mai 1967) Aber auch der "ge- mäßigte" Hussein ließ eine Briefmarke drucken, die ein hashemitisches Königreich bis zum Mittelmeer zeigt, in dem Israel nicht mehr existiert. Das ägyptische Artilleriefeuer, sagte der Korrespondent des Beirut Daily Al-Muharrer, tönt "wie Mozarts (!) Neunte Symphonie". - Beim Staatsmord allein soll es aber nicht bleiben. Ihm soll ein Volksmord hinzugefügt werden. Der unversöhnliche Hass gegen Israel richtet sich auch gegen die Israelis und konvergiert so mit dem Vernichtungsantisemitismus. "Der Hass, den wir unsern Kindern einprägen, ist ein heiliger Hass", sagte der syrische Unterrichtsminister. Eine UNESCO-Kommission begutachtete arabische Schulbücher: sie empfahl die Rücknahme von acht und die Änderung von 59 Ausgaben. In vielen von ihnen wird die Sprache des internationalen Antisemitismus geführt.
