

Name of Course: World Studies

Course Overview:
<p>World Studies is the required ninth grade social studies course. This course takes a regional approach to world events and issues. Issues and skills addressed in this course include, but are not limited to, analysis of historical sources, American involvement in world affairs, the changing role of human rights, and the economic effects of world events. All units are designed to provide students a deeper understanding of how global issues/events have an impact of U.S. history, and how the U.S. has influenced world history.</p> <p>Primary Resource: Materials used in this course are primarily from Choices, curriculum developed by Brown University.</p> <p>Common assessments in this course include unit honors challenge projects/presentations, socratic seminars, and end of the unit tests.</p> <p>* A special education version of this course is offered which incorporates appropriate modifications.</p>
