

Alert & Warning Case Study Questions

1. What **Planning and Organizational** unique or challenging aspects of this case jumped out at you?
 - Navigating stakeholders and being able to change plans mid-course. Example, creating space for the private sector to give their pitch so they can feel heard and then be more willing to listen.
 - Planning in time to change course/make modifications/handle hiccups
 - Considering cultural differences between public and private sector organizations
2. The **Educational** stage of the A/W case was complex and diverse; what other ideas do you have for making this (or this type) of challenging case more manageable?
 - Setting priorities to make task ahead more manageable
3. The **Negotiation** stage relied heavily on giving more 'authority' to the statutory members named in the legislation—what might have been an alternative method to allow for consensus to be reached?
 - Non-Statutory members might be consultative partners, rather than decision-making partners, leading to potential tensions down the road
4. (If your group has time)—What are the most obvious/overt **implementation** challenges for this (or this type) of case?
 - What is “representative”, is there a minimum level of institutional authority for the representatives to be effective
