This section contains the research background, a clear statement of the problem, literature review, the proposed approach or solution, research gaps and hypotheses (if any).


In general, it uses times new roman, 12 pt, 1.15 for space, left and right aligned, on one-sided pages and on A4 paper (210 mm x 297 mm) with the normal margin (upper, lower, left and right each 2.54 cm) and maximum 12 pages for original research article, or maximum 16 pages for review/survey paper. The manuscript is written consisted of introduction, the comprehensive theoretical basis (*optional*), method, results and discussion, conclusion.

METHODS

In this section used to state research design (i.e., qualitative, or quantitative). The subsection should be detailed enough to explain about how they execute their research and conduct the data (i.e., research ethics, sampling, and consents). In the data collection method, the researcher describes in detail the approach in collecting data (eg, interviews, observations, and so on) by describing the types of techniques used (eg, structured interviews, participant observation, and so on). Authors should explain about measurement/s that are used in research which also include the validity and reliability of the instruments and for the data analysis method, the researcher includes an approach in analyzing the data obtained.




Figure 1 (image no.). Image caption (Sentence case).
