All of these will go in the Google doc that you share with me at the beginning of the semester.
 I'll put headers w/targets in everyone's docs so that you'll know where to put stuff at different stages.

- The "deadline" is when I'll go in and download a copy of your doc and grade that version. As
 long as you've shared your doc with me at the start of the semester, you don't have to "turn
 anything in" for these assignments because I'll already have access to it.
- **DO NOT** work on your stuff anywhere other than in the Google doc that you shared with me at the beginning of the semester. It almost always ends badly.

Minor assignments

- **via Google docs**: "draft checks" to make sure that you're keeping up with where we're at in the process and "work checks" to make sure you're working on your paper during class time as indicated. As long as you've shared your doc with me, you don't have to do anything to "turn these in"; you just need to make sure you're keeping up with the expectations.
- via D2L: your info post and status updates will be submitted as text posts (not attachments) under "Assessments" → "Assignments" (typically Sundays 11:59 p.m. as indicated); questions for your classmate interviews will be posted on D2L under "Communication" → "Discussions."
