IMSC Spring Show Guide/FAQ for Parents

SHOW DATES: March 21st and March 22nd, 2026

Spring Show Sign Up: There will be a new ‘class’ for registration. There is an Ice Show Girl/Ice Show Boy class.

******There will be a ‘Non-Refundable’ costume deposit due at sign up of \$25 for either class.

Girls will be charged \$85 total for their costume and ice fees for the show.

Boys will be charged \$50 total for their costume and ice fees for the show.

This fee offsets the costumes and the cost of ice/coaches for the 3 weeks of practices for this performance! Boys may need additional items like a pair of black pants and a long sleeve white button up shirt, this will be communicated. Girls...there will be tights available for purchase as well if needed!

There will be an ‘additional costume’ class that is only needed if your skater is doing multiple numbers and they are ordering more than one costume (typically our advanced level skaters).

******Any Kwik Trip Fundraising done by your skater, will be applied to skater accounts in time for the costume pickup to offset any costume balance.

******For boys a pair of black slacks and a long sleeve white shirt may be needed in addition....for girls show tights will be available for purchase closer to the show.

There are 3 shows total - 2 on Saturday and 1 on Sunday. Shows are typically at 1pm and 5 or 6pm on Saturday and 2pm on Sunday. Tickets are required to watch the show and will be sold at the door.

Volunteer Requirement for the show - Parents will be required to sign up for 3 hours per skater up to 2 skaters/family for show preparation. These aren't hard to hit and there are MANY options to help out for show!

SHOW COMMITTEE - these are the people who help make the show fun for the skaters and a great experience for attendees. The show committee makes props, decorations and guides the decorating for the show. The committee will also help coordinate the program, flowers for sale at the rink, and other show-related tasks and extras. ****More to Come on This...Parent Meetings** will be initiated to organize all aspects of the show and volunteer opportunities will be various!******

Practice schedule - Please note - skaters practice 2 times a week in the 3 weeks leading up to the show beginning after the last 6 week term finishes up. This season our show practices will take place during our normal ice times Monday, Wednesday, and Sunday between February 17th and show weekend. Current Ice Times are Monday 5 PM-7 PM, Wednesday 5 PM-7:45 PM, and Sunday 2 PM-5:45 PM. So, ice show practices will be scheduled during these dates/times! The practices may not be on the normal day you skate! **If your skater requires a religious accommodation for scheduling, please communicate this with a board member or their COACH when you sign up!** The practice schedule for each group will be sent out as soon as possible! Please make sure your SportsEngine account is configured for email and text alerts in case of changes we cannot anticipate [LINK HERE!](#)

******There will be an attendance form that will need to be filled out if your skater will miss practice(s) due to a scheduled conflict. Of course, we always expect parents to use good judgment in the case of illness and ask that you notify the board if your skater will miss due to illness.

Show Participation - Skaters are expected to participate in all 3 shows show weekend, unless illness or last minute emergency. Numbers are choreographed based on participants and participation is needed. If you know your skater will have other obligations, please speak with a board member or coach right away to see if participation is viable for the show.

SHOW WEEK - the week of the show, there will be regular show practice, in addition there will be a TECHNICAL RUN THROUGH on Thursday, March 13. A FULL DRESS REHEARSAL on Friday, March 14. TWO shows on Saturday, March 15 and ONE show on Sunday, March 16th. Technical and Dress rehearsals are mandatory for all skaters and for hall monitors/runners.

Photos - Photo day will be scheduled after costumes are received. Photos are taken by group and then each individual skater. A schedule will be communicated! Skaters should be in full costume and ready to go at least 15 minutes prior to scheduled photo time.

Outstanding Balances - All ice fees, fundraiser balances and any outstanding fees must be paid prior to show practices beginning. Please see a board member as soon as possible if there are any issues or concerns.

Technical Run-through Thursday, March 13th @ 4:30 pm: This is a mandatory practice. We will start promptly at 4:30 with ALL skaters on the ice for grand finale. Skaters should have a skate guard in one hand to take on the ice. Then skaters must be in the back hall or in the players bench at least 4 numbers before they are scheduled to get on the ice. It is the parent's (or whomever is at the rink with the skater) responsibility to ensure the skater is ready to get on the ice. There will be lists at the rink posted so please use them to follow along with the program. Please note - tech run through order may not reflect actual show order. **You and Me Number participants should all be ready to skate by 5:45pm. Skaters may be able to leave after their number IF their coach doesn't need them to practice anything else. Please check with their coach.**

Dress Rehearsal: Friday, March 14th @ 4:00 pm This is a mandatory practice. This will start promptly at 4:30 with the grand finale and then a run through of the show from start to finish. Please plan to bring snacks or something to eat during this time. Concession stand will be opened. This practice will last until 6 pm. Before leaving, please check with your skaters coach.

Spring Show Performance: Saturday, March 15th @1 pm & 6 pm; Sunday, March 16th @ 2pm. Skaters should be prepared to arrive at the rink 30-45 minutes prior to the start of each performance and are required to remain in the locker rooms. If the skater needs to leave the locker room, please confirm with the locker room mom. Locker room monitors are to be in lockers rooms with skaters until the end of the show.

Illness: If your child is sick, please do not have them participate in the practices/show. In the past, we have had sickness pass through our locker rooms from skaters that were sent to the show sick. The kids are in close quarters in the locker rooms and illness can pass from skater to skater easily. Also, Spring Break is a week after the show and families do not want to be sick for their long week off.
