

So this activity is a bit of a favourite of mine and an opportunity to do some artwork. So this is Inuit printing. So the Inuit who live in Northern Canada are actually there's some really great artists doing both sculptures and printing. So we're going to have a go at doing that ourselves. So for this activity, we'll need just a bit of phone card, some acrylic paint, a roller and a paint palette as well.

So we're going to actually have a go at making our own print. We do this using the foam card. And I'd suggest a pen where you can actually draw what you wish to get printed. And then you actually score into the card the actual outline of the shape of what you're designing.

Next, once you've done your kind of engraving, the next thing you need to do is to put the paint into the bowl.

Then using your roller, literally, just make sure you get a nice, even spread of paint across the roller itself. So right across on from end to end, and then you're good to go. So next you want to roll the paint across the phone card. Okay, then spread the paint evenly across the cardboard.

Done.

Next moment of truth is to turn the card over onto. I've got a piece of a free paper underneath, and all I'm going to do is flip that over and then press it down and then kind of lift the phone card away from the paper.

If you can see that, then this is my Antarctic Penguin.
