

Whereas the economy has faltered in the aftermath of the H5N1 pandemic

Whereas students are not in the best position to deal with a crisis

Whereas students should be the future of our government and economy

Whereas giving more money to students for the purposes of paying for education will give universities more money to operate and allow for more resources to be available to students.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:

Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the Student Crisis Relief

Definitions

2. Student refers to someone who is over the age of 16 and has attended secondary or post secondary school in the last 12 months.

Measures

3. This act will provide \$50M towards the generation of new francophone student business opportunities across Canada.
4. This act will invest \$50M into continued growth of bilingualism in Canada.
5. This act will provide \$1.5B towards new university scholarships for all students.
 - a. This money will be allocated to a Canada-wide pool and be distributed until the pool of money is used.
 - i. Students who are part of households that have incomes under \$30k will be granted the maximum of \$5000
 - ii. Students who are part of households above \$30k and below \$50k will be granted \$3000
 - iii. Students who are part of households from \$50k to \$100k will be granted \$1000
 - iv. Students who are part of households above this amount are granted \$500
6. This act will provide \$600M towards the creation of the *Student Entrepreneur fund*.
 - a. Students who are attempting to start a business may apply for up to a \$30,000 government loan payable at 1% interest per year until it is paid off.

- i. Only Students who are currently not in school may have access to this loan. Those who re-enroll after receiving the loan will be forced to pay it back in full immediately.
 - b. Any money collected from interest is returned to the fund and may be used again.
- 7. This act will provide \$100M towards a fund which allocates money for the purposes of helping students create and maintain Model Parliaments in various cities around Canada.
- 8. This act will provide \$200M toward the creation of better mental health programs to help Canadians recover from the trauma felt during the pandemic due to the quarantine.
