1. OASSA **WINTER TRADITIONAL** CHEER STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

- a. Categories include:
 - i. BUILDING
 - ii. NON-BUILDING
 - iii. NON-TUMBLING/NON-BUILDING
 - iv. HYPE
- b. Both Middle School AND High School Teams
- c. Winter (Traditional) Regional Qualifiers will precede the Winter (Traditional) State Championship.
- d. See section 2 for qualification rules.
- e. NOTE: **GAME DAY** Cheer State Championships are held on a different weekend and will be during the FALL sports season.
 - i. Teams are encouraged to compete in both the Fall (Game Day) AND Winter (Traditional) State Championships.
 - 1. You must qualify at the Fall (Game Day) Regional Qualifier in order to compete at the Fall (Game Day) State Championship.
 - 2. You must qualify at the Winter (Traditional) Regional Qualifier in order to compete at the Winter (Traditional) State Championship.

2. ELIGIBILITY

a. HIGH SCHOOL (9-12 grades)

- i. The OASSA Regional Qualifier events and State Cheer Championship events are for Varsity cheer teams in Grades 9-12 only. Teams may combine to compete. For example, members of the JV or Freshman squads may be combined with the Varsity squad to create a competition team.
- ii. **The following teams are NOT eligible to compete:**
 - 1. All-star teams
 - 2. Middle School/Junior High (grades 7-8) teams/members
- iii. Every cheerleader has to be on either a sideline cheer team with a high school or a competition cheer team with a high school and has been on the cheer roster for the current year. *(Example: A team cannot add a member of the gymnastics team to the cheer roster for Regionals and State or add on a cheerleader who competes for a local all-star team but is not part of the high school cheer program.)*

b. MIDDLE SCHOOL (7-8 GRADES)

- i. The OASSA Middle School State Cheer Championships competition are for middle school/junior high cheer teams in Grades 7-8 only. Teams may combine to compete. For example, members of the 7th and 8th grade teams may be combined to create a competition team.
- ii. **The following teams are NOT eligible to compete:**
 - 1. All-star teams
 - 2. High School teams/members
- iii. Every cheerleader has to be on either a sideline cheer team with a middle school or a competition cheer team with a middle school and has been on the cheer roster for the current year. *(Example: A team cannot add a member of the gymnastics team to the cheer roster for State or add on a cheerleader who competes for a local all-star team but is not part of the middle school cheer program.)*

- c. **Academic Eligibility - It is a district decision. Currently, OASSA does not follow OHSAA guidelines (TBD for 2027-2028).** It is a local decision with the school district, although sometimes districts will group together for such rules by conference. **Please check with your school's Athletic Director for Academic Eligibility guidance.**

3. QUALIFICATION

a. HIGH SCHOOL (9-12 Grades)

- i. Only teams who qualify at a Winter Cheer Regional Qualifier may compete at the Winter State Championships event.
 1. Teams may attend **ONE** Winter Regional event out of the five events offered. Teams may attend **OUTSIDE** your "home" region based on your schedule needs and travel abilities (Teams can only attempt to qualify at **ONE** regional event but can select the date that works best for the team regardless of the location).
 2. Regional Qualifiers are qualifier events, **NOT a competition**. Your team will not be competing against the teams at your scheduled regional.
- ii. You must obtain a 75% score or higher to qualify for the state championship.
- iii. All scores will be released following the event for your reference.
- iv. Teams will NOT be broken down by Divisions (D1, D2, D3, D4, D5, D6) at the Regional Qualifier.

b. MIDDLE SCHOOL/JUNIOR HIGH (7-8 Grades)

- i. Middle School/Junior High teams may register/pay to attend a Winter Regional Qualifier, but **ARE NOT REQUIRED** to attend in order to compete at the Winter State Championships.
 1. They will receive feedback (not scores) from the judges for the State Championship.

4. STATES CHAMPIONSHIP CHEER GROUPS DEFINED:

a. HIGH SCHOOL (9-12 Grades)

- i. The division splits for the Regional and State Cheerleading competitions will be based on total girls' enrollment.
 1. OASSA follows OHSAA's reporting years to determine the OASSA Cheer Division Breaks. **Each reporting year is every two years. (ex. 2026 is a reporting year, 2028 (August) will be the next reporting year).**
 2. OASSA High School Cheer Division breaks for our 2026-2027 competitions: (based on total girls' enrollment reported to ODE. These divisions are **NOT** the same as OHSAA's Divisions set for all other sports under its jurisdiction).
 - Div 1 – 516 and more girls' enrollment
 - Div 2 – 348 to 515 girls' enrollment
 - Div 3 – 204 to 347 girls' enrollment
 - Div 4 – 144 to 203 girls' enrollment
 - Div 5 – 89 to 143 girls' enrollment
 - Div 6 – 88 and fewer girls' enrollment
 3. To check the school's reported girls' enrollment and the School ID #, visit the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) website and use the "School

Directory” feature, found here:

4. NOTE: Non Tumbling/Non Building (Performance) AND Hype Cheer Categories will **NOT** be broken down by Cheer Divisions. Please see the section below.

ii. **NON-BUILDING and BUILDING Categories:**

1. OASSA will follow industry standards that if there are **15 or more teams within a particular category**, ***we reserve the right*** to break the category down into large and small.
2. If 15 or more teams qualify for the State Cheerleading Championship within an OASSA Cheer Division (1-6), the qualifier list will be sorted based on SIZE OF TEAM. By doing this OASSA is able to make sure there is a competitive element and a level playing field element.
 - a. Small Varsity (15 cheerleaders or less)
 - b. Large Varsity (16 cheerleaders or more)
 - c. **There must be a minimum of 3 teams in a category to justify the split at State.**
 - i. **Example: If there are 17 schools in a Division/Category, but only 2 would be small and 15 would be large, OASSA reserves the right to not divide that division.**

iii. **NON TUMBLING/NON BUILDING (Performance Category) ONLY**

1. **WILL NOT BE BROKEN DOWN BY CHEER DIVISION (D1-D6) BREAKS.**
2. **WILL BREAK DOWN BY TEAM SIZE ONLY.**
 - a. Small Varsity (9 cheerleaders or less)
 - b. Medium Varsity (10-15 cheerleaders)
 - c. Large Varsity (16 cheerleaders or more)

iv. **HYPE CHEER ONLY**

1. **WILL NOT BE BROKEN DOWN BY CHEER DIVISION (D1-D6) BREAKS.**
2. **WILL COMBINE ALL TEAMS FOR THIS CATEGORY.**
3. *Hype Cheer Category is only for High School teams.*
- v. **If only one team is registered in a Division/Category, OASSA reserves the right to combine that one team with a similar Division/Category to not be alone in any division.**
- vi. **OASSA reserves the right to split or combine divisions accordingly, based on the number of teams in each division and category.**
- vii. **OASSA reserves the right to reassign any team registered in the incorrect event category at the time of Regional Qualifiers.**

b. **MIDDLE SCHOOL/JUNIOR HIGH (7-8 Grades)**

- i. **OASSA Middle School/Junior High Cheer Groups for our 2026-2027 competitions are based on TOTAL enrollment (boys & girls) of the school (These groups are NOT the same as the High School breaks).**
 1. ***Coaches are to enter the TOTAL enrollment at registration.***
 - a. To obtain the school's (7th & 8th grades only) total enrollment (boys & girls), please reach out to your Athletic Director or Principal for this number.
 2. Once ALL registrations are received, OASSA will split the teams per category into TWO groups, Small & Large. To create these two groups, OASSA will

take the total enrollment numbers and find the median. This number(s) will be used to define the break between the two groups.

3. **NOTE:** Non Tumbling/Non Building (Performance) Category will **NOT** be grouped down by total school enrollment.

- a. **Non Tumbling/Non Building (Performance Category)**

- i. **WILL NOT BE GROUPED BY TOTAL SCHOOL ENROLLMENT.**

- ii. **WILL BE GROUPED BY TEAM SIZE ONLY.**

1. Small (9 cheerleaders or less)

2. Medium (10-15 cheerleaders)

3. Large (16 cheerleaders or more)

4. *OASSA reserves the right to split categories as needed, based on the number of teams registered.*

5. *Hype Cheer Category is only for High School teams.*

5. SCORING

- a. OASSA will be using **RegChamp** to score at Regionals and States.
- b. Each judge has the responsibility and authority to review and submit his or her final scores prior to the final tally of the scores for all teams using the new system. A Quality Judge will be at the State Championship to double check all scoresheets.
- c. Score sheets and rubrics are uploaded to the scoring system:

- d. **REGIONAL QUALIFIER:**
 - i. High School Teams:
 1. Scores will be given at all regional cheer events for high school teams.
 2. Teams must receive a **75% score or higher** in order to move on to the State Championship.
 3. Head Coach/Advisor will receive scoresheets following the event via the email address that was used to register for the event.
 - ii. **Middle School/Junior High Teams**
 1. **Feedback/Comments will be given to any Middle School/Junior High teams who attend a regional.**
 2. **Scores will not be given.**
- e. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIP:**
 - i. Judges' scores will be compiled to determine the overall team score.
 1. Scores will be added together for total points, THEN deductions are taken from the total points to get the final score.
 2. All scores will be final.
 3. All head coaches of each team will receive an email from **RegChamp** with their final score.

6. JUDGING PROCEDURES

- a. All judges will sign an integrity policy to ensure professionalism.
- b. The judges for the events will be appointed at the sole discretion of OASSA. All judges will have been vetted by experience in the field as well as knowledge of the scoresheets and

rubrics. All judges will have completed the OASSA Judges Application as well as the Judges Training Course.

- c. OASSA will have certified NFHS safety judges at STATE level.

7. TIE BREAKERS

- a. All ties will be broken. If there is a tie, the total points from the “overall performance” category on the score sheet will determine the winner.
- b. If there is still a tie, the total of deductions will be used to break the tie (the team with fewer deductions will receive the better placement).
- c. **If there is still a tie in a division, the motion execution score from all scoresheets will be used to break the tie.**
- d. After the third attempt to break the tie, the total panel of judges will make the final decision by video review.

8. RULES & PROCEDURES

- a. Any questions concerning the rules or procedures of the competition will be handled exclusively by the **Head** advisor/coach of the team and will be directed to the OASSA Cheer Director. Such questions should be made prior to the team’s competition performance.

9. SPORTSMANSHIP

- a. All participants agree to conduct themselves in a manner displaying good sportsmanship throughout the competition with positive representation upon entry and exit from the performance area as well as throughout the routine.
- b. The advisor/coach of each team is responsible for seeing that team members, coaches, parents and other persons affiliated with the team conduct themselves accordingly.

10. INTERRUPTION OF PERFORMANCE

a. UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES

- i. If, in the opinion of the competition officials, a team’s routine is interrupted because of failure of the competition equipment, facilities, or other factors attributable to the competition rather than the team, the team affected should STOP the routine.
- ii. The team will perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred. The degree and effect of the interruption will be determined by the competition officials.

b. FAULT OF TEAM

- i. In the event a team’s routine is interrupted because of failure of the team’s own equipment, the team may either continue the routine or withdraw from the competition.
- ii. The competition officials will determine if the team will be allowed to perform at a later time. If decided by officials, the team will perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred.

c. INJURY/ILLNESS

- i. The only persons that may stop a routine for injury/illness are:
 - 1. competition officials
 - 2. the advisor/coach from the team performing

- ii. The competition officials will determine if the team will be allowed to perform at a later time. If the competition officials allow a routine to be performed at a later time, the spot in the schedule where the re-performance is to take place is at the sole discretion of competition officials. The team may perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred.
- iii. The injured/unwell participant who wishes to perform may not return to the competition floor unless:
 - 1. The competition officials receive clearance from, first, the medical personnel attending to that participant, second the parent (if present) AND THEN the head coach/advisor of the competing team.
 - 2. If the medical personnel do not clear the participant, the participant can only return to the competition if a parent or legal guardian in attendance signs a return to participation waiver. In the event of a suspected concussion/head injury, the participant cannot return to perform without clearance from a licensed medical professional that has training related to head injuries, even with a waiver from a parent or legal guardian.

11. INTERPRETATIONS AND/OR RULINGS

- a. Virtual meetings will be held in summer 2026 as well as the week before the Winter (Traditional) State Championships. Dates for these meetings will be sent soon.
- b. **Prior to Event:** Rules interpretations will not be done over the phone. In order to receive the “official” rules interpretation, a coach must send a video of the skill in question to the OASSA Cheer Director.
- c. **During Event:** Any interpretation of any aspect of these Rules and Regulations or any decision involving any other aspect of the competition will be rendered by the **Deductions Judge(s) and Head Judge**. They will render a judgment in an effort to ensure that the competition proceeds in a manner consistent with the general spirit and goals of the competition. If needed, the OASSA Cheer Director will also assist in these interpretations.
- d. OASSA has adopted the rule interpretations of the National Federation of High School Association: www.NFHS.org.

12. FINALITY OF DECISIONS

- a. By participating in this competition, each team agrees that all decisions by the judges will be final and will not be subject for review. Each team acknowledges the necessity for the judges to make prompt and fair decisions in this competition and each team therefore expressly waives any legal, equitable, administrative or procedural review of such decisions.
- b. Deduction sheets/emails will be sent to the coaches at the email address used to register for the State Championship. The **Head** Coach will have the ability to contest deductions. Once awards are completed you will not be able to discuss any deduction given.

13. PENALTY INFORMATION

- a. NO loose body, face, or hair glitter permitted.
- b. Wearing body jewelry is a **NFHS** penalty (unless approved for medical or religious reasons).
- c. Failure to stay within the time limit will result in a time violation. See deductions for more detail. OASSA judges will give a 3 second grace period of time going over.

- d. In the event that the first 3 seconds of a routine needs to be restarted due to equipment failure, not being set for start of routine, etc. You will be allowed to begin your routine again without penalty. This must be in the initial 3 seconds of the routine (music or cheer) after an organized set or spirit entrance.
- e. Refer to the [Cheer Penalty Sheet](#) on the website for full penalty and deduction information.
 - i. NFHS Violations (See Penalty Sheet)
 - 1. Minor - ie: stepping or landing on a prop, uniform violation (ie crop top)
 - a. 0.25 point
 - 2. Moderate - ie: improper grip such as a flip that loses connection due to execution, not intent
 - a. 1.0 point
 - 3. Major - ie: double full in tumbling, double twisting basket in stunt
 - a. 3.0 points
- f. OASSA has adopted penalty information from the National Federation of High School Association: www.NFHS.org.

14. NO DISQUALIFICATION

- a. OASSA no longer renders total disqualification decisions at the State Championships. However, failure to follow these rules will result in a substantial penalty. This includes OASSA event rules, including USA Cheer and NFHS.

15. SAFETY RULES

- a. To ensure consistency and ease of compliance for cheer teams, OASSA has adopted the rules of the associations referenced below. Any updates to these rules will be posted to the webpage at <https://oassa.org/rules-regulations/> when known.
 - i. All Building and Game-Day Building Teams are to follow the USA CHEER rules and guidelines.
 - 1. USA Cheer and the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) have reached an agreement to publish one set of rules for high school cheerleading under the NFHS Rule Book.

 - ii. All Non-Building, Non-Tumbling/Non-Building and Game-Day Non-Building Teams are to follow the rules and guidelines stated in the National Federation of HS Associations "National Federation Spirit Rules Book."
- b. **GENERAL SAFETY GUIDELINES**
 - i. All participants agree to conduct themselves in a manner displaying good sportsmanship throughout the event. The coach of each team is responsible for seeing that team members, coaches, parents, and any other person affiliated with the team conduct themselves accordingly.
 - ii. All programs should have, and review, an emergency action plan in the event of an injury.
 - iii. Coaches must recognize the entire team's particular ability level and limit the team's activities accordingly.
 - iv. No technical skills should be performed when a coach is not present or providing direct supervision.

- v. All practice sessions should be held in a location suitable for the activities of cheer.
- vi. Warm-up and stretching should precede and conclude all practice sessions, competitions, performances, and other physical activities.
- vii. The team coach or other knowledgeable designated representative should attend all practices, functions, and performances.

16. MUSIC GUIDELINES/MUSIC COPYRIGHTS EDUCATIONAL INITIATIVE GUIDELINES

- a. Please visit <https://www.usacheer.org/music> for latest music guidelines and restrictions. Also visit <https://www.usacheer.org/music-faq> for a list of FAQ's.
- b. Before teams perform at a Regional Qualifier or the State Championships events, each team must submit a signed "Terms of Agreement/Music Certification" document. Coaches/advisors must confirm in writing that they have read and understand the USA Cheer "Music Copyrights Educational Initiative" and warrant to OASSA that all sound recordings used in their team's music shall only be used with written license from the owner(s) of the sound recordings. **(Please include a copy of your Proof of Purchase or Certificate of Authenticity, if available.)**
- c. For the most up to date music copyrights information, visit the "Music Copyrights Educational Initiative" webpage at <https://www.usacheer.org/music>. If there are any questions, teams should email info@usacheer.net for guidance. Please check their "Preferred Provider" list periodically for updates and changes.
- d. Each team must have a coach/representative to play the music.
 - i. The coach/representative is responsible for bringing the music to the DJ table for the team. Music may be on a phone, iPod, etc. (mute phone, turn on airplane mode and turn up "MEDIA" volume all the way). Please bring more than one source to play your music.
 - ii. The coach/representative is responsible for pressing "play". Should **the designated music person** choose not to stay at the music table for the duration of the routine, and a malfunction occurs, teams may or may not be permitted to perform the routine again. **The event DJ will NOT be allowed to press play for your team. It must be a representative from your team.**

17. ROUTINE RULES (BUILDING, NON-BUILDING, NON-TUMBLE/NON-BUILD & HYPE)

- a. **TEAM PARTICIPANTS:**
 - i. **At this time, there is no minimum or maximum limit on the number of team members allowed on the floor, per event.**
 - 1. *However, cheer teams are encouraged to keep team size reasonable in order to not detract from the overall performance.*
 - ii. Teams whose members participate in multiple cheer events may "cross-over" (switch out) a number of participants between categories.
 - iii. In order to compete on a team, the participant's name must appear on each team roster by event category as a Paid Participant or Unpaid Non-Participant (Alternate/Injured).
 - 1. In order to compete at the Winter State Championship , all participants MUST have appeared on your Regionals Roster (Winter).
 - 2. You may compete with more or less athletes at the State Championships, but cannot change your respective division as possible SMALL OR LARGE.

- iv. Individuals may not support one another in any type of mount/pyramid/ stunt in the Non Building and Non-Tumble/Non-Build divisions. This includes supporting the weight of another individual when that person's feet do not touch the ground.
- b. **PROPS:**
 - i. [OASSA Approved Cheer Prop List](#)
 - ii. Please refer to [USAcheer.org](https://usacheer.org) for the most current legal prop listing.
- c. **ENTRANCE:**
 - i. First organized movement/choreography is the start of the timing.
 - ii. Judges will not score anything until timing starts or anything after timing ends.
- d. **TIME LIMIT:**
 - i. 2 minutes and 30 seconds (2:30) for the full routine.
 - ii. Teams must use music for at least 45 seconds (:45) and not more than 1 minute and 45 seconds (1:45) during their routine.
 - iii. OASSA will give a 3 second grace period of time going over.
- e. **POINT DEDUCTIONS:**
 - i. It is important to maximize the routine to the best of the team's ability. However, just "attempting" a skill is not enough to earn full credit – a team needs to execute it correctly. One of the most difficult parts of judging is determining the number of points to deduct from a team for falls and execution in a stunt/pyramid and tumbling.
This is the deduction/safety judge, and head judges' responsibility.
 - ii. OASSA will assess Major and Minor NFHS deductions. A minor deduction is less than a major deduction.
 - iii. See the [Penalty and Deductions Sheet](#) for additional information.
 - 1. NOTE: Standing Tumbling is limited to **one** tumbling skill and a back tuck is the most elite tumbling skill allowed.
 - a. Examples: Standing full is not allowed. Rippled Single Back Handsprings would be allowed.
 - b. Jump tumble (single skill) would be allowed

18. GENERAL REGISTRATION RULES

- a. **STATE CHEER COACHES REQUIREMENT (Head Coach, Assistant Coach, Or Volunteer Coach):**
 - i. A coach who is registered with their team for each Cheer State Championships must be **Board Approved by their School District**. Coaches who are not Board approved will not be able to enter with their team or have access to the **TEAM ONLY** areas of the event. Additional individuals are encouraged to attend the event, however they will need to attend as a spectator and purchase a spectator ticket.
 - ii. If your team employs an outside choreographer, they will not be permitted in the team only areas. They will need to purchase a spectator ticket and are encouraged to come and cheer their team(s) on!
 - iii. **State Cheer Fees:**
 - 1. The first (2) coaches are free.
 - 2. Each additional coach will be charged a fee of \$10 per coach.

3. Board approved Coaches must be added to the roster by Regionals.
4. No additional coaches may be added to the roster at States.

b. CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY:

- i. Teams/Coaches who cancel at least two (2) weeks before the date of an OASSA Event will not be charged or may request a full refund.
- ii. Teams/Coaches who cancel fewer than two (2) weeks before an OASSA Event will be charged the full registration amount.
- iii. No shows and teams/coaches who cancel the day of an OASSA Event will be charged the full registration amount.

c. CHANGES TO ROSTERS:

i. REGIONALS:

1. The deadline to update roster(s) is (1) week prior to the scheduled Regional.
 - a. **This includes COACHES, TEAM PARTICIPANTS, ALTERNATES/INJURED.**
 - b. **ALL changes will need to be updated by the Coach who registered the team AND within the RegChamp registration platform.**
2. If there are changes AFTER this deadline, WEEK OF regionals, OR DAY OF REGIONALS, please email Kelly Miller-Latham at klatham@oassa.org.
3. **COACH AND/OR ATHLETE ADDITIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE SCHEDULED REGIONAL.**

ii. STATES:

1. **COACH AND/OR ATHLETE ADDITIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**
2. **In order to compete at each of the State Championships, all participants MUST have appeared on the teams Regionals Roster.**
 - a. All team members must appear on the roster as “Participating Team Members” (COMPETING) or “Non-Participating Team Members” (NOT COMPETING; *Stand-by/Alternate/Injured, etc.*)
 - b. Explain any non-participating members or special circumstances (*stand-by as needed; injured or academic ineligible – awaiting clearance to compete, etc.*) in an email to Kelly Latham at klatham@oassa.org.
3. The coach who registered the team will be able to update team counts for any participants not able to compete at States.
 - a. Alternates replacing an injured participant.
 - b. Participants are no longer on the team.
 - c. If the team count will be less at States due to an injury with no alternates to replace them, please keep the following in mind:
 - i. If the division splits into small, medium, and large for States (per Section 2), the registered team count at Regionals will determine the size the team will compete in at States. If the team is Small at Regionals, the team remains Small at States.
 1. Example: If a team registered 16 participants at Regionals, this puts them in the Large group for that division. The team must remain Large even if a team loses a participant(s) to injury and/or no alternates.

d. PAYMENT:

- i. **Regionals - Payment is due (2) weeks prior to your scheduled Regional.**
- ii. **States - Payment is due (1) week prior to the State Championship**
- iii. Types:

1. Purchase Order/District Check
 - a. Purchase orders must be provided within **7 days** of registration.
 - b. If you do not have your PO at time of registration, please EMAIL Kelly Miller-Latham at klatham@oassa.org
 - c. Print the Invoice from your email confirmation and send it to your treasurer/boosters.
2. Booster Check
3. Personal Check
4. School or personal credit card
 - a. ***A credit card processing fee will be applied.***
- iv. Payment confirmations will be sent at the conclusion of registration.
