In this workshop, we will explore how to take that raw material and transform it into a finished studio painting. # Supply List

## **Visual Resources**

I will supply several still life bouquets of flowers to paint.

## **Planning & Sketching**

Notebook/sketchbook, make sure NO LINES

Pencil with eraser

Viewfinder

## **Paints**

Any professional-grade will do. Avoid “hues,” as these are less concentrated color.

Titanium White (large tube)

Cadmium Yellow Light

Yellow Ochre Gold (or regular Yellow Ochre)

Ultramarine Blue

Cadmium Red (or Permanent Red Medium)

Quinacridone rose

Cadmium Orange

## **Painting Surface**

Bring 2-3 panels, sized 8x10 or 9x12.

I prefer Centurion Oil Primed Deluxe Linen panels, available through Jerry’s Artarama and sometimes the Steamboat Art Museum Gift Shop.

## **Mixing Color**

Palette (can be 11x14 size plexiglass or Palette Paper). Most portable easels have a palette included in the set-up

Palette knife for mixing paint (optional)

## **Brushes**

Flats, Brights, or Filberts recommended for the majority of the work. Have a good range of sizes: 2,4,6,8

**Paper Towels** – thick blue mechanics paper towels or Viva

**Solvent** – Odorless Turpenoid, odorless mineral spirits. Gamsol, or Spike of Lavender

### **Wet Canvas Carrier**

RayMar panel carrier, for example

Pizza boxes work too

### **Equipment**

The Depot will provide tables and chairs.

You may want to bring an easel so that you can work vertically. I recommend a Field Easel or Pochade box (The Prolific Easel, Strada, Open Box M, Guerrilla Painter, Soltek, etc.) or a Julian French Easel.
