




In an effort to save our culture here are 2 more reasons why the Internet is no substitute for a library

What You Don't Know Really Does Hurt You

The great boon to libraries has been the digitization of journals. But full-text sites, while grand, aren't always full. What you don't know can hurt you: 1. articles on these sites are often missing, among other things, footnotes; 2. tables, graphs, and formulae do not often show up in a readable fashion (especially when printed); and 3. journal titles in a digitized package change regularly, often without warning.

The Internet: A Mile Wide, an Inch (or

Less) Deep Looking into the abyss of the Internet is like vertigo over a void. But the void has to do not only with what's there, but also with what isn't. Not much on the Internet is more than 15 years old. Vendors offering magazine access routinely add a new year while dropping an earlier one. Access to older material is very expensive. It would be useful for students to have access to more than just the scholarly materials written in the last 10 to15 years.



The Old Capital: A Novel of Taipei

Chu T'ien-hsin's The Old Capital is a brilliant evocation of Taiwan's literature of nostalgia and remembrance. The novel is centered on the question, "Is it possible that none of your memories count?" and explores the reliability of remembrances and the thin line that separates fact from fantasy.


Comprised of four thematically linked stories and a novella, The Old Capital focuses on the cultural and psychological realities of contemporary Taiwan.

The novella is built on the memories and recollections of a woman trying to make sense of herself and her homeland. After a trip to Kyoto to meet with a friend, she returns to Taipei, where, having been mistaken for a Japanese tourist, she revisits the sites of her youth using a Japanese colonial map of the city. Seeing Taipei anew, the narrator confronts the complex nature of her identity, embodied in the contrast between a serene and preserved Kyoto and a thoroughly modernized Taipei.

An intertextual masterpiece, The Old Capital is a moving and highly sensual meditation on the elasticity of memory and its power to shape personal identity.

The Mulvaneys of High Point Farm in Mt. Ephraim, New York, are a large and fortunate clan, blessed with good looks, abundant charisma, and boundless promise. But over the twenty-five year span of this ambitious novel, the Mulvaneys will slide, almost imperceptibly at first, from the pinnacle of happiness, transformed by the vagaries of fate into a scattered collection of lost and lonely souls. It is the youngest son, Judd, now an adult, who attempts to piece together the fragments of the Mulvaneys' former glory, seeking to uncover and understand the secret violation that occasioned the family's tragic downfall. Each of the Mulvaneys endures some form of exile-physical or spiritual - but in the end they find a way to bridge the chasms that have opened up among them, reuniting in the spirit of love and healing.

Ms. Kathleen Joy Recommends: Outlander



Time travel, drama, adventure, romance, action and suspense – the book Outlander has it all. Outlander is the first novel by Diana Gabaldon about Claire Randall, a World War II nurse who surprisingly travels through time from 1945 to 1743.

She finds herself caught up in a Scottish resistance against the English and all sorts of other danger. Nevertheless, she shows resourcefulness, determination, a fighting spirit and resolution – traits I think heroes possess.

Like all novels, Outlander teaches us lessons. These are the important reminders I see from the book:

- It is important to stand up for yourself. Your voice deserves to be heard and when you refuse to let others crush your worth, you show yourself what you're capable of doing.
- It is important to apologize. Sometimes we go beyond our limits and say and do things that aren't acceptable. It is better to say sorry to the people we hurt to keep our friendship solid
- It is important to know that you can do the things you think you can't. You'll be surprised with how quickly you can adapt when you're thrown into a situation with very few resources and unfamiliar faces.
