	 Positive feedback from the Quiz night, participants enjoyed the cheese and wine rather than a full dinner. After the Quiz, Sheila wants to run feedback about the events to see if all years are being represented. She thinks it is very important for parents of younger years to contribute as their involvement will be more significant that from parents in year 6 whose child is leaving after that year. Sheilla would like to ask what is the expectation of the parents from the PTA, what would like the PTA to organize/contribute to.
2.	Finance Update – Paul Paul showed a comparison of this and last years where we can see that takings have been similar if not slightly up. Current balance £37,665 including £2,000 from D&G and takings from the cake sale. PTA paid £7,900 to the school for the creation of a "wellbeing area" for the children. The takings from this year are similar to others. Paull was asked about D&G payment time scale and he estimated that it was slightly delayed but will be paid shortly.

	 Vitoria Mance introduced herself as a parent governor and creator of the Sell/exchange Facebook group for SM parents. Most donations are now online and some carry a 20 pence admin charge. Debbie Richards asked about budget and donations, these are mostly online or done electronically , she wanted to know if these methods are here to stay as she wants to teach her children about money. AMG and the PTA members acknowledged the parents' concerns but expressed that the electronic methods are more practical and haven't hindered the ability to collect money despite a 20 pence handling surcharge when selling tickets for some events so they will become permanent. The Summer fair uses tokens, this can be used to teach children about money.
