

College Credit in High School

Eligibility

- Seniors- Have to rank in the top half of their class, have a 3.0 GPA or higher, and must achieve proficiency on MCA tests.
- Juniors- Have to rank in the top third of their class, have a 3.0 GPA or higher, and must achieve proficiency on MCA tests.
- Sophomores - Have to have a 3.5 GPA, and must achieve proficiency on the 8th grade MCA tests and may only take 1 CTE (Career and Technical Education) course the first semester. If successful (earning a B or higher) the sophomore student may register for 2 courses the second semester.

College Credit to High School Credit Ratio

- 4 College Credits = 1.0 High School Credit
- 3 College Credits = .75 High School Credit
- 2 College Credits = .50 High School Credit
- 1 College Credits = .25 High School Credit

ITV (ECCO) Courses

- Classes hosted by other high schools and Pine Tech for college credit
- You will attend the class here at school via Zoom, it will show up in your high school schedule

PSEO Courses

- Taken through the college, taught by a college professor
- You register for these classes online
- Full-Time PSEO
 - At least 12 credits
 - Maximum of 16 credits per semester.
- Part-Time
 - Less than 12 credits
 - High school classes with other PSEO classes
- Associate of Arts Degree - 2 year, generals
 - **YOU**, along with your academic advisor at the college, are responsible for knowing if you are on track to graduate with an AA.
 - Mrs. DeVlaeminck can help to some degree

Important Information

- When you are an ECCO or PSEO student, you are considered an **adult learner**.
 - The HS or your parents **DO NOT** have access to academic information through the college (grades, course material, schedules, etc.)
 - If you have a question about deadlines, course work, etc. **YOU** are responsible for reaching out to your professor/the college with your question.
 - You are responsible for knowing how many credits you have earned and what classes you need to take to graduate from OHS, with the school counselor's assistance.
- Students must maintain a C-average or 2.0 GPA in each course in order to maintain in good standing as a college student. If a course is failed, withdrawn too late, or falls below a 2.0 GPA, a meeting will be called involving the student, their parent/guardian, the school counselor, and an administrator to discuss the student's eligibility to take college courses in the future and reimbursement for the failed course. If the student is deemed eligible to take college courses again, they will be on academic probation.
 - If courses fail the next semester, or fall below a 2.0 GPA, the student will not be allowed to take college classes again and will need to reimburse the school for the funds of the class.
