There is a TV that Charlie installed recently, a table, and a varied collection of couches, possibly from past tenants who just had no more room in their moving truck as they left.



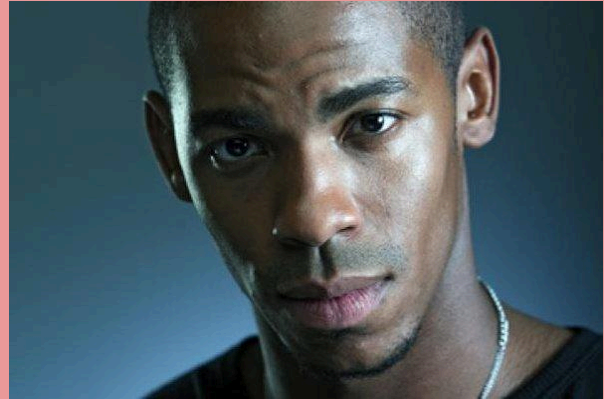

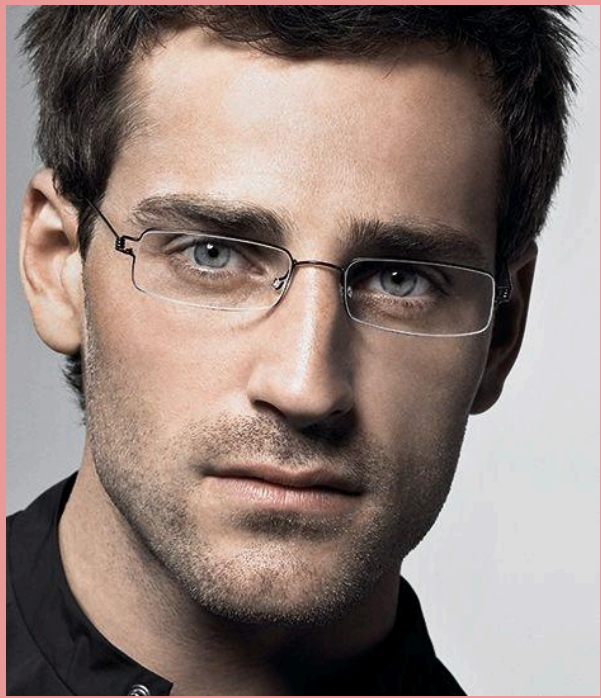
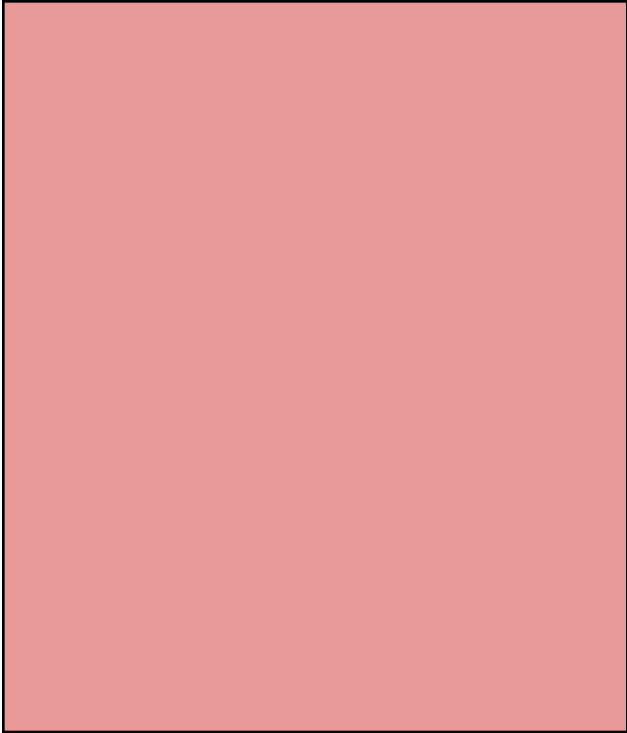
