5. If you **won** a lot of money, what **would** you **buy** first?
6. If you **study** English next year, where **will** you **study**?
7. If you **were** an animal, which animal would represent your personality
8. If there **were** a fire in your home, what **would** you **save**?
9. If you **could go** anywhere tomorrow, where **would** you **go**?
10. If you **have** enough \$ for a holiday this year, where **will** you **go**?
11. If you **could live** in any country in the world, which country **would** you **choose**?
