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How to perform surgery

The basics of surgery are as simple as it sounds, A surgery will mainly consist of /me, /it and /roll. These commands are based on your creativity and completely depend on how you want to do the procedure.

/me command:

This command is used for when you are performing actions and in this case during surgery

/it command:

This command is used for when either the patient is explaining something such as an injury or result of a blood test.

/roll command:

The most important command of them all as it determines if an action is successful or not

Tips and tricks

If you're struggling to think of a /me you may use the machinery and scenery around you to give you a little extra time to collect your thoughts.

Try not to roll on every action if it isn't needed, for example rolling for each and every stitch you are putting into a wound as it would take ages!

Preparing for a surgery can be very helpful as it takes a lot of pressure off your shoulder due you understanding how you want to do the procedure you can prepare for a surgery a variety of ways such as:

- Researching how procedures are done
 - Getting your /me's ready beforehand (only if you can)
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
