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SCHOOL OVERVIEW

The Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary (SHNJM) established our school in 1919. While the sisters have not been physically present in our school program for many years, their charism is still present in everything we do. Just as the SHNJM are dedicated to the full development of the whole person, Saint Monica School strives to do more than provide an exceptional academic program. We strive to nurture and grow each child so they may reach their full potential. Our Mission and Philosophy reflect this commitment to educating the whole child.

MISSION STATEMENT

Our mission, guided by our Roman Catholic Faith, is to provide a supportive and nurturing learning environment that fully challenges and engages each student academically, physically, and spiritually.

PHILOSOPHY

The Saint Monica School Community believes in living Jesus' message of respect, love, and concern for one another. Our parents, faculty, staff, clergy, and parishioners cooperate to build a community that fosters the religious, intellectual, moral, social, cultural, and physical growth of each student. We continue the welcoming tradition of our founding religious order, the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary, to provide our community members with an education in the Catholic faith.

SCHOOL PROFILE

- **FOUNDED:** In 1919 by the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary.
- **ENROLLMENT:** Approximately 150 co-ed students in TK- 8th grade
- **FACULTY AND STAFF:** Saint Monica's faculty and staff include 9 classroom teachers. Additional faculty/staff include a Science Teacher, Librarian, Extended Care director, and Learning Support Teacher. Our faculty standard is for teachers to hold a valid California Teaching Credential. Several of our teachers have earned advanced degrees or additional certifications.
- **SCHOOL HOURS:** Mon/Tues/Thu/Fri 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. on regular school days; Wednesdays dismissal is at 2:00 p.m. and 12:30 p.m. dismissals occur on select minimum days.
- **OFFICE HOURS:** 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. school days.
- **DEMOGRAPHICS:** Reflecting the rich diversity of the city with our student body identifying as approximately 39% Caucasian, 34% Asian, 25% multiracial, 2% African American. Approximately 10% identify as culturally Hispanic.
- **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Our mission is to offer an education in the Roman Catholic faith. We welcome students of all faiths and religious backgrounds to our community. Examples of spiritual activities include student-led prayer at Morning Assembly, daily Religion Classes, and monthly student-led liturgies celebrated in Saint Monica Church.
- **FINANCIAL AID:** Available to qualifying families via The BASIC Fund, the Archdiocese of San Francisco Family Grant Program, and/or Saint Monica Parish and School Tuition Assistance.
- **FUNDRAISING:** Annual tuition covers a portion of the true cost of each child's education. Our parent-led fundraising adds an average of \$100,000k per year from the fall and spring fundraisers and the Annual Auction Gala. Families are required to contribute to these events.

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OUR PROGRAM OFFERINGS

CAMPUS: Our campus includes nine regular classrooms and dedicated spaces for Science, Library, Art, Music, Learning Support, Counseling, Extended Care, and an onsite gym for PE and Sports.

ACADEMICS & CO-CURRICULARS: As reflected in our Schoolwide Learning Expectations (GRACE), we offer values-based education that strives to recognize the gift that each child brings to our school.

- Robust academic core curriculum including English Language Arts, Literature, Vocabulary, Social Studies, History, Math, Science, and Religion.
- Spanish language and Physical Education instruction is offered twice a week to all students.
- Hands-on Art instruction is provided weekly to all grades in a dedicated Art Room using different media and to learn artistic concepts, foundational principles, and elements of design.
- Music instruction is provided weekly to all students in our dedicated Music Room. Our program is centered on monthly Mass and other special performance events.
- Learning Support Services are offered for students in grades TK-8 based on need, including small group pull out, in classroom support, or 1:1 support.

STEM EDUCATION

Our science center offers students a dedicated space for experimentation alongside their core curriculum. Middle school receives daily science instruction in the science center with the Science Teacher. K-5th grade students receive core instruction in the classroom with their classroom teacher and lab experimentation instruction once a week in the science center with the science teacher.

In addition, we complement with field trips, to sites such as the CA Academy of Sciences, the Exploratorium, Point Reyes National Seashore, and more. We are a 1:1 technology school with iPads in the lower grades and use Chromebooks in the upper grades. Classrooms and learning spaces are outfitted with flat screen monitors and document cameras. Our robust enrichment programs provide a range of additional STEM clubs for students after school.

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APPLICATION PROCESS

We accept applications for all grades throughout the school year and transfer students are welcome at any time. Families of all faiths are welcome.

TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION (Applications are considered when all the following has been provided):

- \$50 non-refundable application fee
- Completed school application form
- Copy of the child's birth certificate
- Copy of the child's baptismal certificate (if baptized Catholic)
- Completed Preschool Recommendation Form (for incoming TK/K students) or copies of report cards of the past two years from child's previous school (students entering grades 1-8)

STUDENT ASSESSMENT

Incoming TK/Kindergarten Assessments:

A child must be five years old by September 1st to be eligible for Saint Monica School's Kindergarten. Children are eligible for TK if they have their *fifth birthday between September 2 and December 2*. After an application has been submitted, an appointment for the TK/Kindergarten Readiness Assessment will be scheduled. TK/Kindergarten acceptances and enrollment are based on a rolling admissions process.

Incoming 1st – 8th grade Assessments:

Acceptance into 1st-8th grades at Saint Monica School is based on a child's readiness for our program. Incoming 1st graders must be six years old by September 1st to be eligible for 1st grade. The office staff and respective grade-level teacher(s) will schedule and administer an assessment of academic readiness (student visit day preferred). Acceptance is based upon social development, the academic assessment, and review of the principal and respective teachers.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ENROLLMENT

The developmental and behavioral age of a child is a strong factor in considering acceptance. The developmental age is the child functioning as a total person: emotionally, intellectually, physically, and socially. Prospective students must be fluent in English. The priority for acceptance is:

- Sibling of current student
- Catholic student
- Non-Catholic student

OTHER REQUIRED FEES:

- Application Fee: \$50 per child (new students only)
- Annual Registration Fee: \$500 per current student (\$600 for new, incoming students)
- Annual School Maintenance Fee*: \$500 per family

* The School Maintenance Fund is to build facilities improvement or emergency savings funds to cover capital improvements and repairs. The total fee may be paid over 10 months (\$50 per month) and is included with the regular scheduled monthly tuition payments.

PARENT OBLIGATIONS

In addition to the above, parents commit to participation in the fall and spring fundraisers, and the Auction Dinner Gala.

- Fall fundraiser: The Fit & Fun Run: Families contribute a minimum of \$500 to the event. Contributions can be raised through sponsorships or families can opt to "buy-out" by submitting payment of \$500 to the front office.
- Spring fundraiser: The Read-a-thon Rally: Families contribute a minimum of \$500 to the event. Contributions can be raised through sponsorships or families can opt to "buy-out" by submitting payment of \$500 to the front office.
- 30 Family Service Hours: 25 general service hours per family for the school year (value equity is \$25.00 per hour. 5 hours toward the Auction Dinner Gala.
- Auction Dinner Gala: Each family is required to purchase 2 tickets to the Auction Dinner Gala or "buy-out" by submitting the equivalent payment value of 2 tickets. Parent service hours (5 hours) are required for promotion of the Annual Auction Dinner Gala (value equity of \$100 per hour), managed by the Parent Club Fundraising Committee and School Administration.

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TUITION ASSISTANCE OPPORTUNITIES

Financial aid is available for qualifying students from the following sources and programs. Families will need to apply to these programs separately from the school admissions application.

THE BASIC FUND

The BASIC Fund is a local independent operation that provides a wonderful resource for tuition assistance. Applications are available only for new students who will be attending a private school for the first time. Family siblings who will be newly attending Saint Monica School are also eligible to apply. Older siblings who are not currently participating in the BASIC Fund may be included on the new application as long as one student in the family is attending for the first time. Please inquire directly with the BASIC Fund for specific questions regarding the application process. Priority is given to applications received by earlier dates for the coming school year. Late applications may be directed to waitlist status if funding is not available at time of application submission.

ARCHDIOCESE OF SAN FRANCISCO FAMILY GRANT PROGRAM

The Archdiocese of San Francisco has chosen TADS (<https://www.mytads.com>) to process applications for the Archdiocesan Family Grant tuition assistance program. To apply for an Archdiocesan Family Grant for the next school year, parents are required to complete the process online. Go to the TADS website to begin. Once on the TADS homepage, click the link "Financial Aid Assessment." Once you have completed the online form, submit all required information/documents and your application will be processed.

The firm deadline for submitting an application is April 15th for the coming school year.
