Teachers Report:

Kōwhai:

We have built up two full classes and started another new class in R.11.

Carol Fernando has started in Room 11 and we're thrilled to have her join the team.

Korimako are busy practicing hard for their 2nd ever Kapa Haka Road trip which will happen early next term.

We have been learning a mixture of songs from the main Kapa Haka group, songs from our mihi whakatau, songs that fit the learning in our classrooms, and some new songs Shareen and Kaiya have been teaching Teams 1 and 2. We are on track and are sounding really good.

We will visit a couple of kindy's and hopefully Malvina Major to perform for the residents there as well.

Harakeke:

Team Harakeke have been getting to know each other through our Ko wai au? Inquiry, along with learning about our team name. We had a session with Carmen on the tikanga around Harakeke, along with learning how to extract muka. We have made a collaborative Harakeke cloak.

We have been learning the Ngake and Whataitai pūrākau and have recently explored retelling through drama.

For our Forces Inquiry we have explored Magnets, Electricity, Friction and Floating and Sinking. The children moved around our space, to explore various provocations before diving deeper by learning important vocab and processes.

Kahikatea:

In Kahikatea we started the term by delving into Aotearoa's history from early Māori settlers to Te Tiriti o Waitangi. Then we began building knowledge in preparation for our noho marae. In particular we discussed the pōwhiri process and tikanga that we need to follow.

With our trip being postponed to this week, this gave us some time the past couple of weeks to start our forces inquiry. We've explored the properties of magnets and used this as a topic for descriptive writing.

Tarikākā:

Our big focus for the first half of the term was getting to know each other and our unique identities then Camp!

The second half of the term has been focusing on Force and Energy, looking at the laws of motion and the six simple machines. We're finishing off by building Marble Runs that include as many of the simple machines as possible.

CAS festival feedback:

1. Personnel, Employment, Professional Development

1.1 Personnel and Professional Development

We have appointed Carol Fernando as a teacher for Room 11 starting on 31st March, through to the end of the year. Carol has been a full time classroom teacher for many years and recently moved to Wellington from Rotorua. She set up a roll-growth classroom last year for another school in the Kāhui Ako. Carol's class starts with 6 students, and we are projecting that it will grow to around 18 students towards the end of Term 3, when we will appoint

another New Entrant teacher for our next enrolments.

Learning and Life at CAS

Our Tarikākā camp to El Rancho was very successful. Staff, students and parents spoke positively about the venue and the camp staff. Children enjoyed a range of challenging, fun and memorable activities. Staff at the camp commented that the CAS group was the 'best behaved' they'd had through for a long time- they found the children to be exceptional with their manners and conduct. We continue to be very grateful for our incredible parent helpers on EOTC activities like this- positive, energetic, committed to create an enjoyable, safe and memorable camp for all children.

Our Year 3 and 4 trip to Maraeroa (and overnight Noho Marae for our Year 4s) has been postponed due to a tangihanga. A new date has been set for 9th and 10th of April, and the team are quickly planning around the change. Some of our parent helpers were still able to make themselves available for the new date and we're really fortunate to also have parents available to support at short notice.

Next term we commence our school-wide inquiry on Astronomical and Solar systems (ie Space) with class trips to Space Place. Towards the middle of Term 2 Kahikatea and Tarikākā (Years 3-6) will start their planning and preparation for the school production, which will take place mid Term 3
