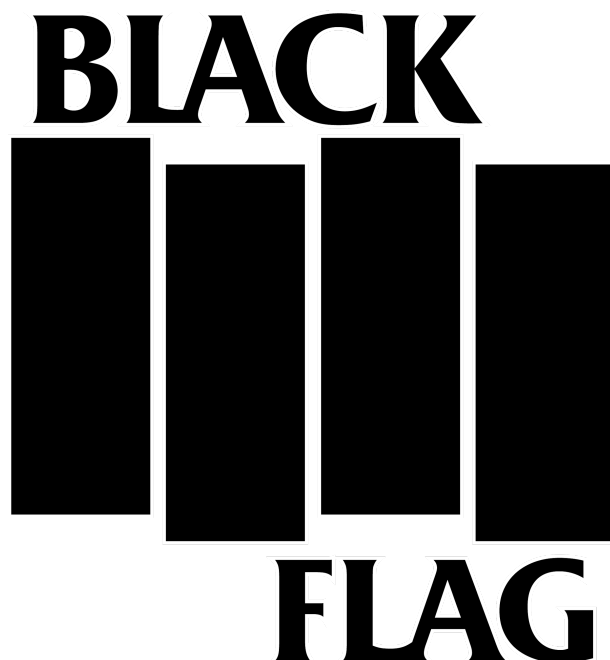

This is my third year captaining NLTP. I'm also on the NLTP CRC, as well as a Mumble administrator and a Tagpro moderator. I moved to California recently, so this will be first season on Centra.

How would you describe your coaching style?

Tryhard, motivated, critical, deeply committed. 100% all in for the team and our success. Hard but fair - I don't play favorites because I don't have any.

What is something unique about you, as a captain?

I tend to draft older, more mature players, because I'm old as fuck, and don't want to hang out with a bunch of whiny kids. Seriously though, there's no age limit or anything, I just tend to draft players who are a little more grown up, in personality if not in years.

What types of players are looking for in this season's draft? Any particular traits or qualities you are keeping an eye out for?

To be successful on a Ranger team, you have to be more on the thinky side and less on the emoty side. I like players who choose to pretend this silly game matters, even

though we know it doesn't really. If you want to win, and you're willing to take criticism and be coached, without having a chip on your shoulder or taking it personally, as an actual attack on your humanity, then my team is a good place for you.

Technical skill is kind of a mix of innate ability and practice. As long as you have some of both, your technical skill will come along with coaching. Learning what to do is almost as important, if not more so, than having the ability to actually do it.

How often do you plan on practicing?

Probably twice a week

Any special plans for practices above the typical scrimms and going over maps?

Scrimms are great, but before you can scrim on a map, you have to talk through the basics of how O and D need to operate on it. How are the offenders going to get grabs and work together to get out of base. How will the defenders contain, what positioning should they use, and what are likely reset scenarios. Who will be responsible for watching which pups and why. After that you can put it into action in scrimms.

What would you say are your strengths and weaknesses?

Strengths: Incisive - I can quickly pick out exactly what we're doing wrong and articulate it. I typically see the root cause of a problem immediately. Dedicated - I want everyone to get better and improve and win and taste that feeling of awesomeness that comes from triumphing together as a team.

Weaknesses: Insensitive - I'm not a very feely person, so my coaching is never intended as a personal attack - but people who are sensitive often have difficulty dealing with that style and tend to either develop calluses or break under the pressure. I could take it easier and care less, but then I wouldn't be me.

Favorite map?

If someone is interested in playing for you what steps should they take?

Figure out whether you're a memer or not. I don't really draft memers. Rick Slick was an exception, because his memes were actually funny.

Otherwise, come to tryouts - I won't be paying any attention to tryouts until after the minors draft, because it's important to know who's going to fall to NLTP. But basically, come to tryouts, and let me know that you want to play for me and why. Attitude matters

more to me than almost anything (even technical skill, even to a fault), so if what you're reading here sounds like a fit, let me know that.

Any last words?

People come play Tagpro because it provides a sense of belonging - sure the competition is nice, but there are better games for that; this is a community, and people make friends here. If you're on my team, win or lose you become part of our culture and have a home on Mumble. I want people who are willing to invest and work hard, so we can have the kind of fun that comes from playing well and succeeding together, not the kind of fun that comes from just fucking around and nothing else. 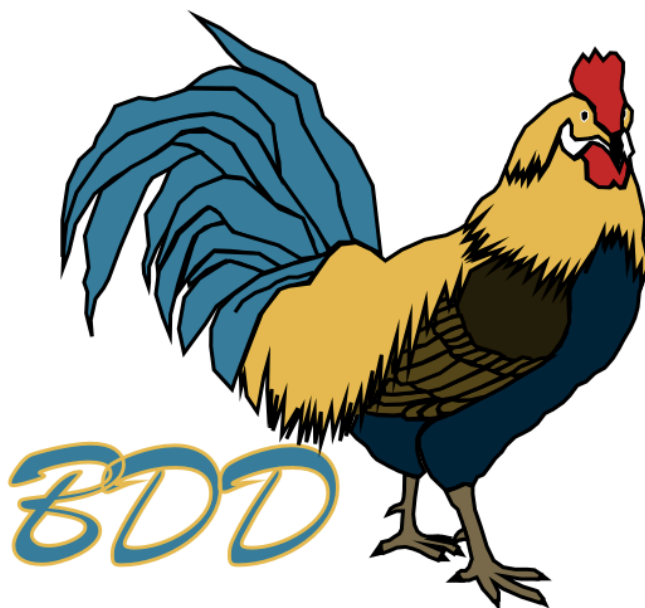

How would you describe your coaching style?

Although I was minors captain last season, this is my first time actually coaching a team, so it will be a learning experience for me. As a coach, I think my job is to equip all

of my players with the knowledge and experience they need each week. I want to have my team motivated and I will do that with positive reinforcement.

What is something unique about you, as a captain?

I captained my tennis team in high school and I am a project coordinator for a software team at work, so I'm looking to bring the skills and talents from that area of my life into TagPro.

What types of players are looking for in this season's draft? Any particular traits or qualities you are keeping an eye out for?

In the game, I'm looking for players who are good decision makers, good communicators, positive energy, and who have a high ceiling. If you have some of these qualities, I will probably have my eye on you, but there is always room for improvement in these areas and these are also the things I'm looking to teach, so don't worry if you aren't the best at these things.

Outside the game, I'm looking for people who are nice, dedicated, and malleable. What I mean by that, is I'm looking for people who are willing to take one for the team and who aren't just in it for themselves. Also, if you are a dickbag, I won't draft you.

How often do you plan on practicing?

2 nights a week.

Any special plans for practices above the typical scrimms and going over maps?

I think when you do a lot of intrasquad, you get in a comfort zone that is not good for game day when you play people you aren't familiar with.

Secondly, I'll be doing co-sketches (ugh, I hate them) and maybe some drills at the beginning of every week. Map knowledge is vastly important to play and communication, so I'll do my best to impart that on my team.

What would you say are your strengths and weaknesses?

As a captain, I think my strength is my leadership and knowledge. I'm also willing to put in the time and effort for my team. The main weakness I can identify right now is my drafting knowledge. I don't know as much about NLTP right now as the other captains do, so I'm going to really have to work hard to draft well this season.

As a player, my main weakness is my focus level, which is something that has really been exposed in minors. When I'm not focused, I become an average-to-bad player. When I am focused, I think I'm one of the best players in the league. As an offender, you have to know how to pace yourself at every moment of the game, even when holding the flag -- you have to know when to go, when to wait, and when to die even. When I'm focused, I make all the right decisions. My strength as a player is my communication and teamwork. I can flip to either side of the ball, so I'm useful everywhere. When things get crazy, and a defender gets on re, I can fill in and generate caps. I'm also a good teammate and I make clutch plays.

Favorite map?

Smirk because it is challenging, but not impossible.

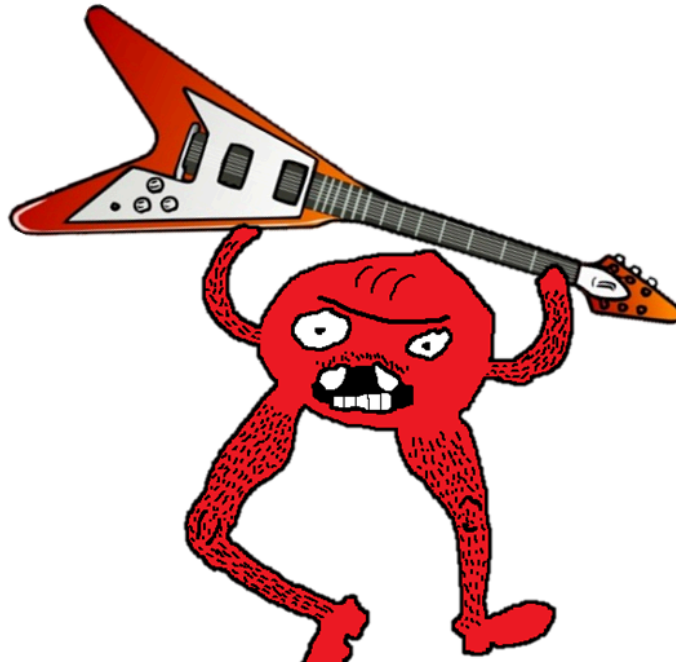

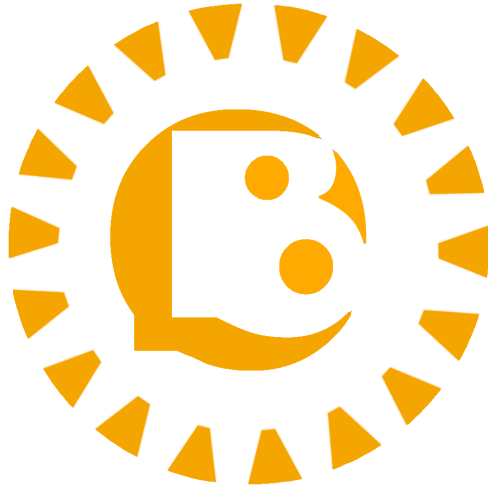

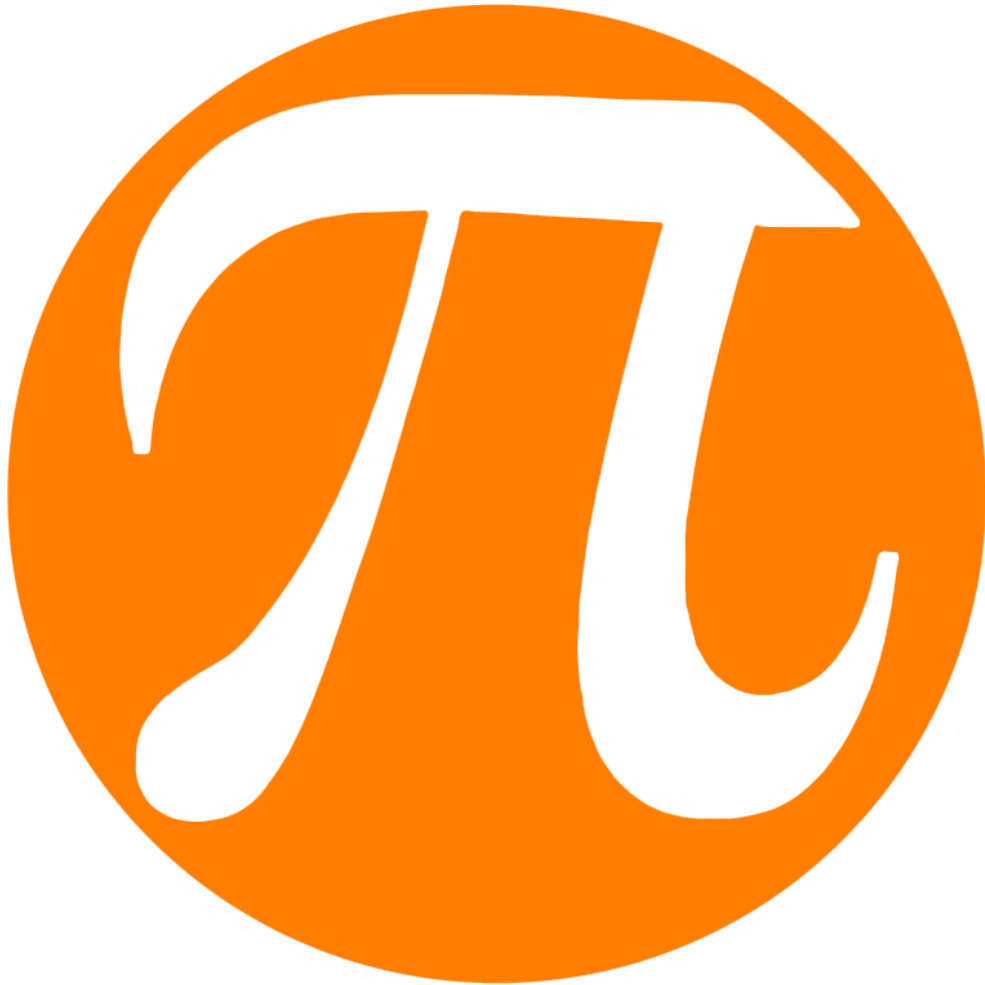
