
## **New video from Canon's ME20f**

Canon's recently announced ME20F-SH camera caused a bit of a stir due to its headline equivalent ISO of 4,000,000. The camera's full frame sensor is tuned for maximum sensitivity and as a result only has a resolution of 2.2MP. Those pixels are supersized, however, which helps greatly improve its sensitivity to light: essentially, the user is able to record in the dark.

Canon Japan have posted vision from the camera, which shows some of the expected applications of the \$30,000 body: shooting wildlife at night and underwater photography are two examples. And although it's destined for specialist shooters it's nice to see a few dings and scrapes on the camera body. This may be a prototype but it certainly looks like it's been tested in the real world.



## **Genus Variable ND Filter**



Ever since the beginning of the DSLR revolution camera operators have complained about having to use screw-in neutral density (ND) filters or matteboxes – countless shots have been missed as shooters fiddle around changing filters. Variable NDs can be a useful option but they need to be swapped between lenses and can introduce colour shifts and polarisation effects.

Their lens adapter with built-in electronic ND is designed specifically for mirrorless cameras and will look similar to adapters from Metabones, Novoflex, Aputure, MTF and others. The one we were shown was a Canon EF to Sony E-mount version.
