- A new math course has been approved for school use beginning in Fall 2020 <u>Technical Math for College</u> and <u>Career</u>
 - Prerequisites are Algebra One and Geometry
- There are changes to the Transitional Math Course offerings beginning in Fall 2020
 - The offerings are now Transitional Math, Algebra 3, and now, Quantitative Literacy.

 - Schools must offer the following 4 courses: Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II, and Pre-Calculus
