Stations for Children with QR codes and other ideas

- Include the physical book with the audiobook and have students read along to improve the use of sight words and fluency.
- Use a graphic organizer like a Concept Map, or on the iPad: Popplet/Wixie to help children organize information and communicate what they have heard about the story.
