Grade Level News

Kindergarten

Language Arts:

Students will focus on how to blend phonemes. High frequency words will be "a", "see", "to", and "we". They will also focus on letters Aa, Cc, Tt, and Pp. Students will read the story, "David's Drawings".

Math:

Module 7: Representing numbers 6 to 10 with objects.

First Grade

Language Arts:

Each class is reading the story, "Dr. Seuss". They will also read decodable readers, "Miss Tess Was Still" and "Nuts for Ben and Jen".

Math:

Module 8: Students will work on counting and writing numbers 8, 9, and 10. At the end of the week, they will sort shapes.

Second Grade

Language Arts:

Students will be reading about super storms. In grammar, they will be focusing on action verbs. Their phonics lessons will be geared around suffixes and diagraphs.

Math:

Module 5- Read, write, and show numbers to 1,000.

Third Grade

Language Arts:

Students will be reading, "Bat Loves The Night" pages 206-224. They will be focusing on questioning, suffixes -able and -ible, and verbs.

Math:

Continue with Module 6. Students will be relating subtraction and division, finding the number of equal groups, representing division, and separating objects into equal groups.

Fourth Grade

Language Arts:

Miss Cottrill's students will continue learning about theme and reading, "Dear Mr. Henshaw." They also will be writing letters to authors.

Mrs. Shipley's students will continue to read classroom novels that cover a variety of ELA skills. They will also begin nonfiction text features.

Books for the 2nd grading period project must be nonfiction and chosen by 12/17/21.

Social Studies:

Week 14- Ohio in the Civil War.

Math:

Students will finish long division and have their Module 7 test. They will begin module 8 over multiplication of 2 digit by 2 digit numbers.

If students need help with homework, they can access math on the spot videos under family resources on the Ed platform that is used for Into Math.

Science:

Finish Life Science Weekly #10 on keeping healthy and fit. Begin Life Science Weekly #10, which will cover Science and Medicine.

Programs in the Building

What is B.L.U.E?

B.L.U.E. stands for Behavior Leading Us to Excellence.

Every nine weeks, students have a chance to earn blue bucks from their classroom teacher. They earn these with good acts of behavior.

At the end of every nine weeks, if a student meets the required amount of blue bucks they will earn a nine weeks reward.

B.L.U.E. is our PBIS program, which stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports.

Below are the three tiers of behavior interventions of PBIS. Students that do not meet our nine weeks reward will receive a tier 2 small group intervention. Tier 3 is used for individual students.

Tier 1: Universal Prevention (All)

Tier 1 supports serve as the foundation for behavior and academics. Schools provide these universal supports to all students. For most students, the core program gives them what they need to be successful and to prevent future problems.

Tier 2: Targeted Prevention

This level of support focuses on improving specific skill deficits students have. Schools often provide Tier 2 supports to groups of students with similar targeted needs.

Tier 3: Intensive, Individualized Prevention

Tier 3 supports are the most intensive supports the school offers. These supports are the most resource intensive due to the individualized approach of developing and carrying out interventions.

PAX Good Behavior Game

Each teacher has been trained to implement this program in their classrooms. PAX is used to increase self-regulation, group regulation, and increase positive behavior amongst students and reduce negative behavior.

Preschool Program


