For example, the U.S. Army is doing trials on a system in which food rations for the troops, called Meals Ready to Eat, in military jargon, are tagged with cheap identifying tags, while the crates they are shipped in carry active tags that measure the ambient temperature.
Other good ideas outside the supply chain include tracing objects through their life cycle.
However, you don't have to get too far beyond these good ideas before you find yourselves in the realm of the bad (or at least the badly thought through).
This would supposedly reduce shopliftingrazor blades are apparently a popular itemby, for example, identifying individuals who are seen to take a packet of blades but never recorded as paying for those blades at the checkout.
The privacy advocates' outcry about a tag that really can trace an individual whenever they're near a reader is easy to imagine.

The placement of the device is usually done with a hypodermic-type needle.
They need to be encased in a special kind of casing that will not irritate or react with the living tissues that they are inserted into.
