Objectives Instruction

Objectives

Each student will score three books using the scoring guide we create together as a class.

Instruction

 As a group, rate the three most recent books you have read aloud to the class. Discuss what the students think about the book and why.

Optional Addition: Pair students up and ask them to think of 3 books they have read.

Then ask them to put them in order from the best book to the worst, out of the three.

Have them share their thoughts on why they put them in that order in small groups.

2) Introduce the idea of 5 stars. 1 being the lowest, 5 being the highest. Brainstorm together with two new partners what key words might work for each star. Share examples to the class.
