Abstract. (In English and Indonesia*) The abstract is about 150 to 250 words in length. The abstract should be clear, concise, and descriptive. This abstract should provide a brief introduction to the problem, objective of paper, followed by a statement regarding the method and a summary of results. The abstract should end with a comment on the significance of the results or a brief conclusion, and novelty of the article. Abstract is written in 11 pt Cambria, and 1 line spacing

Keywords: Maximum of 5 keywords separated by semicolon (;), crucial to the appropriate indexing of the papers, are to be given.

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1. Introduction

The introduction should briefly place the study in a broad context and highlight why it is important. It should define the purpose of the work and its significance. The current state of the research field should be reviewed carefully, and key publications cited. Please highlight controversial and diverging hypotheses when necessary. Finally, briefly mention the main aim of the work and highlight the principal conclusions. As far as possible, please keep the introduction comprehensible to scientists outside your field of research.

The manuscript written uses Cambria (12 pt) with a length of 4,000-5,000 words. The following points are set by Telukawur Journal of Legal Community Empowerment -template file and must be followed to avoid problems in the production of your journal article: (page size: European A4; top-margin: 4 cm; bottom-margin: 2.7 cm; left- and right-margin: 2.5 cm; text is single-spaced, not double-spaced; all pages are portrait orientation).

Citation is done in the style of the American Psychological Association 7th Edition using Mendeley's Reference Manager. An example of citation can be seen as follows (He et al., 2020) or (Honey, 2011)

2. Method

Method: describes the methods used to carry out research / community service. Author can use other methods that are also commonly used. In the chapter name (h1), write as a Research Method or Method of Devotion, according to the conditions of the manuscript.

The results obtained from the research must be supported by sufficient data. The research results and the discovery must be the answers, or the research hypothesis stated previously in the introduction part.

Organise the main text using section headings, and include any equations, figures, tables, lists etc. Following main headings, it allows the authors to use and subsection heading and sub-sub headings. Figures and tables must be placed close to where they are mentioned in the text, not all together at the end of the article. All figures and tables must have a caption. The template file includes placeholder text boxes for a figure and a table. Replace the placeholder information following the instructions in the template. Copy and paste the text boxes to add more tables or figures. Insert equations and inline math expressions using MathType if available. Otherwise use the default Word equation editor. Instead, offer insights into the potential applications or suggestions stemming from the research findings.
