THE PEARL by John Steinbeck

In a literary work, the THEME is the author's major point, the central idea. Theme goes beyond events of the plot to draw major conclusions, or at least leave important questions, about life.

As a PARABLE (a story primarily to teach a moral or answer a question), THE PEARL is basically a message novel. Characters, plot, mood – all the literary elements – are secondary to Steinbeck's thought-provoking messages.
