TESTING - Exam at the end of the class will be overseen by Mike, a PERC recognized Proctor. The exam is administered online and requires the testing student to have a working individual PERC account. See the Be Ready document mentioned herein.

PERC ACCOUNT REQUIRED - Anyone needing to take the exam MUST have an individual account with PERC training site: training.propane.com. Exam takers must sign up for their individual PERC account well **before** class and test his or her login before class begins. PERC tells us that new PERC accounts must be set up 24 hours or more in advance of the scheduled exam. Setting up an individual PERC account is easy and free. Go to training.propane.com to login or sign up. It takes but a few minutes to complete.

PREREQUISITE - You must have Basic Principles & Practices (Book 1.0) to be CETP certified. If you have Basic Principles & Practices - aka Book 1.0 - then you already have a PERC account. If you do not have basic principles you can still take the 3.6 rail car course, however, you will have to complete

basic principles & practices before you are CETP certified. Note that Basic Principles & Practices content is NOT part of the 3.6 railcar textbook.

SKILL ASSESSMENTS: **THE COMPLETION OF THE 3.6 SKILL ASSESSMENT IS <u>NOT</u> INCLUDED THIS CLASS SESSION**. Skill assessments are the last step required by PERC before the student receives a certificate for CETP classes. Certificates will not be issued by PERC until a skills assessment for any given "book" is completed by your company or a third party (i.e., us) and submitted to PERC.

For PERC classes requiring Skill Assessments, like this one, Skill Assessments are required to be completed within one year of the class by you or your company or a third party. If a year comes and goes without submission of the completed skills assessment to PERC, the student will have to retake the exam and then submit his or her completed skills form to PERC.

We can assist with stand-alone Skill Assessment sessions if needed. When you complete online exams through PERC you can then complete the skills evaluation with your chosen Skills Evaluator (i.e., you do this in-house or with a third party (like us). Skills Evaluations are sent directly to PERC. Skills evaluations sent to PERC must be signed by a Skills Evaluator. A Skills Evaluator must complete the evaluation.

If you want us to complete the skills evaluation for this class, much of the skill assessment can be reviewed and handled using video and animations, and we will make arrangements for this separate from this class session. We have reviewed the assessment criteria and our Skills Evaluation will specify the methods used to observe skills activities outside at the railcar unloading riser. We accomplish this with tablets and smartphones using a live stream. Ask us.
