

Graham Treadway Dies: CBT Officer

Graham Richards Treadway, 62, of 600 Cottage Grove Rd., Bloomfield vice-president for public relations and business development at Connecticut Bank and Trust Co., died Tuesday at his home.

The son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Charles T. Treadway Sr., he was an alumnus of Phillips Andover Academy and Yale College (class of 1930), and was the husband of the late Dorothy Clark Dickerman Treadway.

After graduation from Yale he joined The Hartford-Connecticut Trust Company (now The Connecticut Bank and Trust Company) and was made assistant treasurer in 1937 and assistant vice-president in 1943.

In 1944 he entered the U.S. navy as a lieutenant junior grade and served in the Naval Purchasing Office at Chicago until his discharge in 1946. On return from military service he joined the Horton Manufacturing Co., of Bristol as sales manager and was made president of the company in 1950. When the firm was sold in 1952 he rejoined The Connecticut Bank and Trust Co.

Mr. Treadway was active in state and local civic and business organizations and had served as a member of the Connecticut Development Commission since 1958, and more recently as chairman until his retirement in 1969.

He was also a member of the Tri-State Transportation Committee since 1961, a member of the YMCA Board of Directors since 1934, the Community Chest Campaign chairman and vice-president in 1937 and a member of the Board of Directors in 1939, director of Colts Manufacturing Co. in 1950, President of the Family Service Society 1941, recipient of Charter Oak Leadership Medal-1968 New England Council, president of Hartford Golf Club in 1958-59, trustee of Watkinson School from 1958 to 1964.

He was also a member of the Council on Agriculture and Natural Resources, the Governor's Economic Committee, The Area Redevelopment Coordinating Committee, the Clean Water Task Force, The Partners of Alliance, and the New York-Connecticut Bridge Study Group.

He leaves three sons, Graham Richards Treadway Jr., of Bloomfield, John Laird Treadway, of Avon, and Andrew Terry Treadway, of Greenville, S.C.; a brother, Charles Terry Treadway Jr., of West Hartford, and 13 grandchildren.

Memorial services will be Thursday at 3:00 p.m. at the Asylum Hill Congregational Church, Hartford, with a private burial in Fairview Cemetery, West Hartford.
