Semester Three
Continue to take General Education, concentration and cognate courses
Check your advisor assignment at "myOswego", listed on your Student Profile page. Some students are
reassigned after freshman year to an advisor who specializes in a particular concentration.
Meet with your advisor at least once before registration (more as needed):
Before registration: get acquainted if you have a new advisor, review your remaining requirements an

Ask for a copy of the School of Education "Conceptual Framework" brochure
Register for Semester Four
Register for general education, concentration courses and cognates as planned with your advisor
Maintain a cumulative 2.50 GPA
Read current issues of the C&I Advisement Newsletter
Semester Four
Continue to take General Education, concentration and cognate courses
Register for Semester Five
Students who have completed 57-71 credit hours will need an "Alternate PIN" to register. The
PIN is obtained from your advisor after an advising session. Plan ahead to schedule an appointment we
before your registration date!
Register for major "Block One" sequence of courses for semester five if appropriate
Plan travel time for your first practicum placement during Block One (semester five). <i>Leave time</i>
for a three hour practicum and two hours of travel, once a week
Register for concentration, General Education and cognate courses, along with major courses
Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 to be eligible to register for your major courses
Plan to register for SSHS 1020 (Safe Schools, Healthy Students) and DASA 1020 (Dignity for All
Students) workshops within the next two or three semesters to fulfill state certification and graduation
requirements. Completion of SSHS 1020 and DASA 1020 is required before student teaching.
Continue to read C&I Advisement Newsletters
Information to know: 100% of your cognate courses and 80% of concentration courses have to be complete
before student teaching. Grades of C- or higher are required in all major, concentration and cognate courses
Semester Five (Block One)
Begin education "Block One" courses, along with General Education, concentration and cognates
Continue to meet regularly with your advisor:
Meet before registration to check on progress, remaining requirements and plan for remaining courses
Register for Semester Six
Continue Block sequence and plan time to travel to your placement next semester. Leave time for a
two-three hour practicum and up to two hours of travel once a week.
Continue general education, concentration and cognate requirements
Maintain a minimum cumulative 2.50 GPA to be eligible to register for your major courses.
Complete fingerprinting requirement for certification (IdentoGO). Information available at the C&I
Advisement Center or online at nysed.gov. Fingerprinting must be completed before student teaching.
Begin to select samples of your work (for a portfolio you might use for the job search, grad school entrance,
etc.) Examples might be to include exceptional work, work samples from field placements, methods and studen
teaching; certificates, honors and awards, etc.
Continue to read C&I Advisement Newsletters
Semester Six (Block Two)
Take Block Two courses, along with General Education, concentration and cognate classes

Continue to meet regularly – at least once each semester - with your advisor
Plan for the remainder of your program
Make sure you are up-to-date with all requirements, etc.
Count credit hours. You will need a minimum of 120 credit hours to graduate (check Degree Works audit).
Continue collecting work samples
Make plans to complete SSHS 1020 and DASA 1020 workshops, if not already completed.
Make plans to take the NYS Certification Tests; register for tests online
• Content Specialty Test (CST)*; and
• Educating All Students (EAS) exam.
www.nystce.nesinc.com. Most exams are taken later in or after "Block 3" coursework or during student teaching semester. *Childhood Education majors take the "Multi-Subject Grades 1-6 CST", Adolescence Education and TESOL majors take the CST in the area of concentration (mathematics, English, etc.). Register for Semester Seven

Register for appropriate Block sequence classes
Finish General Education requirements, concentration requirements, electives, etc.
Complete fingerprinting requirement for certification (<u>IdentoGO</u>).
Student Teaching applications are available during the last month of the semester. Find specific application information and due dates from the Clinical Practice and Partnerships Office, there is information available on the webpage for C&I Student Teaching. To be eligible for student teaching, you must have completed: 100% of your cognate courses, 100% of your education major core courses (with the exception of Block Four courses), and 80% of your concentration courses; all major, cognate and concentration courses must be completed with
C- or better; and a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or better.
File online for graduation in myOswego, then make an appointment with your major and minor advisor(s) to
review and sign your senior checklist. Ms. Kyle and Mrs. Smith meet with most C&I majors for senior
checklist appointments.
Sign in at <u>www.oswego.edu/myoswego</u>
Click on "Student Records"
Click on "Apply for Graduation" and complete the required information
Make an appointment with Ms. Kyle or Mrs. Smith to review and sign your senior checklist.
Note: Advisees of Dr. O'Toole and Dr. Russo complete senior checklists with them.
Semester Seven (Block Three)
Take Block Three courses
Complete concentration, cognate and General Education course work.
Student Teaching application is due at the beginning of the semester (hand in by deadline date).
Register for and take certification exams as advised or appropriate
Meet with Ms. Kyle or Mrs. Smith to review and sign your senior checklist, if not already completed.
Continue collecting/updating professional portfolio materials
Register for Semester Eight courses (Block Four—Student Teaching)
Student Teaching: ADO 420 and ADO 421 OR CED 420 and CED 421
Professionalism and Social Justice Seminar (2 cr) - EDU 430
Set up an account on the NYS TEACH website.
Complete fingerprinting requirement for certification (<u>IdentoGO</u>).
Begin to think about Graduate Studies
Semester Eight (Block Four)
Successfully complete all Block 4 courses
Attend required Student Teaching Meetings/Workshops
Pick up your cap and gown for graduation at the College Bookstore

Apply for	NYS Teacher Certification <u>after</u> receiving your diploma and submitting the signature form to
