2021 Shorewood High School AP Registration Info

AP Testing: Monday, May 3 - Friday, May 14

Below is information for AP testing this year. As of now, the College Board plans to administer paper tests as they have in the past in the spring. This information is subject to change, pending how the pandemic develops. For now, I would recommend still paying for the tests you intend to take. There are NO cancellation fees this year.

SHS offers AP testing to currently enrolled students in the subjects listed below. This year, we are assigning fees in Infinite Campus, to simplify the process for parents/guardians and reduce fees slightly. *Again this year: students will register and sign up for the test through the College Board's website at https://myap.collegeboard.org/login in their specific AP classroom ("join" codes will be distributed in each classroom). Parents/guardians will pay for tests through Infinite Campus.

Here is what you need to know for this year's AP Exam Registration:

The Two-Step Registration Process:

- 1. Receive a join code in each AP class you are enrolled in within the first few weeks of class; register at https://myap.collegeboard.org/login for each AP course. As soon as you register, you are defaulted to ordering a test. All students will do this, as class resources can be distributed this way.
- 2. Parents/Guardians can pay AP fees in Infinite Campus. These fees will be assigned after October 1st. Fees must be paid in IC by November 2, 2020.
 - a. **If you wish to NOT take a test**, you must see Mr. Brown in person (or via email) to have your registration status changed within the College Board website (https://myap.collegeboard.org/login). You cannot do this on your own, and the default within the website is that you will indeed take the test.
 - b. Any students who have not paid their fees within Infinite Campus by **NOVEMBER 2** will not have tests ordered for them. Mr. Brown will change this status within the College Board website.

Details:

- Parents/Guardians can pay for AP tests between October 2-November 2 in Infinite Campus. If payment is not received by November 2, a test will **not be** ordered for your student. After November 2, a late fee of \$40 will be applied to anyone who wants to still order a test.
- Late Registration begins: November 3, 2020
- This year's AP Exam fee is: \$95 per exam (there is a late fee of \$40 for any student who registers after November 2; there is also no cancellation fee this year due to the pandemic, and people can receive a full refund if they cancel their exams.
- Some AP Exams will be taken in Room 209/210 of the PE Building* (please note the location of testing listed by the exam--other possible spots include the upper gym and the Arena (also in the PE building)).- Most of the rooms assigned below are based on historic enrollment numbers and may change depending on how many students sign up. Students will not leave campus for testing. Exam times are not flexible, so students may miss class to take an exam. Students are responsible for coordinating any missed work with appropriate teachers. (*except Studio Art, which will take place in the art room.)
- Talk to your teachers regarding exam selection: They can help you choose what exams are best for you.

- Visit https://student.collegeboard.org/: helpful information for exam content and format. Please note that afternoon exams may run beyond the normal 3:19 p.m. dismissal time, and other arrangements for after school athletics may need to be made.
- Students with afternoon exams will be excused from their 4th hour class to have more time for lunch. If students are taking two exams in one day, they should bring a bag lunch to eat during the brief break.

REFUND POLICY: We understand that on rare occasions students must cancel an exam. Here is our refund policy:

• Students who cancel an exam by Monday, November 2, are entitled to a full refund (\$95). In addition, those who cancel late (just this year!) will also receive a full refund.

Pre-Administration: There will not be a pre-administration session this year, as the College Board will print bar codes that match up to student information inputted directly into the College Board website. Be sure to complete the online registration form in full and as accurately as possible.

Students--What to bring on exam day:

- 1. Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets (not mechanical).
- 2. Pens, with black or dark blue ink only, for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free response questions in most exams.
- 3. Up to two calculators with the necessary capabilities if you are taking an AP Biology, Calculus, Physics, or Statistics exams. VISIT https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/apcourse to see appropriate calculators.
- 4. A watch if desired (cannot have an alarm or connect to the Internet).
- 5. A ruler if you are taking an AP Physics exam (protractors are not allowed).

THE ABOVE LIST IS ALL YOU SHOULD NEED TO BRING TO THE TEST.

AS A REMINDER, WHAT NOT TO BRING:

- 1. ANY electronic equipment (cell phones, smart watch, i-pods, cameras, etc.).
- 2. Books, compasses, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, notes, dictionaries, colored pencils, etc.
- 3. Scratch paper
- 4. Reference guides, computers, keyboard maps
- 5. Watches that beep or have an alarm
- 6. Food or drink (students may not consume these during testing, but they may have a snack during breaks).
- 7. Clothing with subject-related information
- 8. Ear plugs
