

Ideas

Backlog:

1. Voting platform (not only political but any voting)

MVP: anybody can get a private key from a certificate authority, use that key to vote in any poll. Anybody can create any poll and share a link to the poll. Anybody can see whether a specific person voted or not, the results of the vote (just the resulting percents). There should be no way to trace a person to their vote.

2. Fake news browser extension

MVP: on any news article people could open this extension and see an opposing expert view on the matter, thus balancing the opinions.

3. PAMM service

MVP: traders add a read-only key to their trading terminal. Followers send crypto to the centralized service wallets, then select a trader they want to follow (seeing all the traders, all their deals with ~5 min delay and their historical performance). Traders get their commission from every deal and can withdraw their commission at any time. Followers can deposit and withdraw any amount at any time without any withdrawal fees or limits. Transparency and freedom are a must.

4. Blame machine

MVP: tracing any bad event or product to the people accountable for it in the government. A curated list of events (by date, by geolocation, etc.) with a list of the chain of command that failed to prevent it with all the names and positions that people held during the happening. If you see a pothole on the road or if a school roof collapses you need to be able to look this up in the list and find who are the people responsible.

5. GitHub contributors rewards

MVP: user should be able to select a GitHub issue, donate some money to it and the person who gets their PR merged that fixes this issue should get the reward.

6. Reseller platform for wedding rings

MVP: sellers should be able to leave info, picture and their contact info. Buyers should be able to see the list of lots and the contacts of the sellers.

7. Just mail — extremely simple email client

MVP: just log in and get your email address. See all incoming emails in plain text. Send emails in plain text. That's it.

8. Delete me from social networks

MVP: log in with Facebook, press a button, get all your posts and all your info deleted and then your account deleted as well.

9. A tool that monitors Internet traffic on the device and explains what's what

MVP: install the app, open the app, see the traffic in real-time, click any position to see what type of traffic is that (images, tracking, ads, etc)

10. ICO pool

MVP: register, send ETH to the service, see where the fund invested the money, withdraw and deposit at any time with no fees.

11. Cult Academy

MVP: private entrepreneur school with a hierarchy of mentors to mentees, where more successful fellows help out newbies.

12. Paid Telegram channels monetization bot

MVP: for channel and chat owners — just add the bot as admin, select the price per month and withdraw crypto at any time; get a link to share with potential subscribers. For subscribers — go

to the link, pay the membership fee, get invited by the bot to the private channel or group. The bot should kick people who didn't renew their membership.

13. A tool that stores all Slack messages

MVP: launch the Docker container, add the bot to Slack, get all of your messages stored and viewable with a simple web UI with password authorization.

14. Terminal hub website

MVP: sign in with Facebook, add ssh connect commands (one per "tab"), get all the terminal "tabs" open every time you open this page or login with Facebook

15. Electric freight ships with AI-generated routes

MVP: electric ships; AI takes into account the winds, weather, currents to save the most battery, fully autonomous. Even the loading/unloading can be automatic

16. AB testing platform

MVP: login, create an experiment with needed flags and analytics funnels, integrate simple SDK to fetch flags from the server and send actions to funnels, compare funnels.

17. Mood calendar

MVP: an app that allows you to open it daily, rate your mood from 1 to 5, look back on the previous months to see the trends

18. PDF documentation library

MVP: a list of appliance names/models/serial numbers with their manuals in PDF. Bought a new appliance? Recycle the manual, this list has it in digital format.

19. Reading the best fan fiction on YouTube

MVP: a YouTube channel where the author reads the best fan fiction from the Internet. Like audiobooks but with memes.

20. Data black hole blockchain

MVP: users can register and allow this tool to get as much data about them as possible. Data is anonymized. Big companies can buy this data for research. Money goes directly to people who provided data.

21. Signing IPA files with your own certificates to install 3rd party apps on iOS

MVP: open website, drop compiled IPA or app and certificate, get signed binary back

22. Telegram bot that bans users for the same messages over a set period of time (flood)

MVP: add the bot to a group and make it an admin. Bot now listens to duplicate messages and bans people who send the same message more than 3 times in 15 seconds.

23. Travel insurance in 1 click

MVP: register, fill out your data, add a credit card. Next time you open the app, you have a large red button that you can click — and get travel insurance for tomorrow (or possibly today) bought with 1 click.

24. LTV buy-back

MVP: a subscription service can calculate their LTV and allow users to purchase a lifetime subscription if they pay the whole LTV upfront. Just register, integrate API, setup LTV price and that's it.

25. Folding proteins blockchain

MVP: a fork of Bitcoin that does protein folding calculations instead of mindless hash brute force.

26. Wake-up alarm — money distributed if don't wake up

MVP: set up the time of day when you want to be woken up. Then add your Twitter. Add your credit card. If you don't cancel the service in the morning, it will post one link every 10 minutes of you not cancelling it following which anyone can get \$10 from you.

27. Comment on any Internet page

MVP: open a browser extension on any website, see the comments left by other people, sign in with Facebook to comment as well

28. Superforecasters service

MVP: a website where you can log in with Facebook and participate in simple polls about complex subjects

29. AI training blockchain

MVP: a bitcoin fork where miners train neural networks instead of calculating needless hashes

30. Real-life likes

MVP: open the app, see the map with points of interest around you with the amount of user likes like in the Death Stranding game

31. Bet on anything

MVP: open the website, enter the bet and the options, get ETH addresses for each option, send the link to the bet to your friends. They will see the options and ETH addresses and will be able to bet. Similar to minterscam.com.

32. Central disaster relief

MVP: a website where you can donate to anything but with a condition that every dollar should be described in terms of where it was spent on. Transparency is a must.

33. AI radio

MVP: 24/7 YouTube stream with AI-generated radio host voice and text from the news. Can also automate voice ads.

34. Bitcoin mining lottery clicker game

MVP: a clicker game where every click generates a bitcoin hash. In case if the hash is correct, the player gets the miner reward (which is huge).

35. A tool that shows your stolen passwords

MVP: enter your email, enter the code from the email the service sent, see all your stolen passwords without any masked characters.
