1. Introduction

Here introduce the paper, and put a nomenclature if necessary, in a box with the same font size as the rest of the paper. The paragraphs continue from here and are only separated by headings, subheadings, images and formulae. The section headings are arranged by numbers, bold and 11 pt. Here follows further instructions for authors. Files must be in MS Word only and should be formatted for direct printing, using the CRC MS Word provided. Figures and tables should be embedded and not supplied separately. Please make sure that you use as much as possible normal fonts in your documents. Special fonts, such as fonts used.

1.1. Tables

All tables should be numbered with Arabic numerals. Every table should have a caption. Headings should be placed above tables, left justified. Only horizontal lines should be used within a table, to distinguish the column headings from the body of the table, and immediately above and below the table. Tables must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. Below is an example which the authors may find useful.

1.3. Section headings

Section headings should be left justified, bold, with the first letter capitalized and numbered consecutively, starting with the Introduction. Sub-section headings should be in capital and lower-case italic letters, numbered 1.1, 1.2, etc, and left justified, with second and subsequent lines indented. All headings should have a minimum of two text lines after them before a page or column break. Ensure the text area is not blank except for the last page.

1.4. General guidelines for the preparation of your text

Avoid hyphenation at the end of a line. Symbols denoting vectors and matrices should be indicated in bold type. Scalar variable names should normally be expressed using italics. 2. Manuscript Structure

The manuscript structure was refers to the standard structure of the body as follow:

Abstract. It is the first part of a scientific article. It comprises a summary of the whole content of scientific articles. It brings a general overview about the content of scientific articles to the reader. By reading abstract, readers can decide whether the research topic is relevant to their wish or not.

1. **Introduction (Pendahuluan if written in Bahasa).** It begins with general discussion. The first sentence of the opening paragraph should make readers appeal and curious. Then, the background of research and related previous studies are explained after the opening paragraph and before the end paragraph. This section logically links the existing research problems with the approach that is operated to solve the problem. Introduction ends with the aim and purpose of research or the activity and main research finding.
2. **Method (Metode if written in Bahasa).** It discusses how the research will be done. This section supports and establishes the explanation which is contained in the finding chapter.
3. **Result and Discussion (Hasil dan Pembahasan if written in Bahasa).** It starts with the description of research finding. Then, data analysis of research findings becomes the next explanation. The data analysis is based on the research problem that has been presented in introduction. The descriptions in this section can explain whether the hypothesis which is presented in the introduction can be proven or not.
4. **Conclusion (Kesimpulan if written in Bahasa).** It is the last section in the AIM (RAD) C model. It summarizes some information of the research finding and discussion.
5. **Acknowledgements (Ucapan Terima Kasih if written in Bahasa).** This section is optional; you may remove it if it is not needed.
6. **Conflict of Interest (Konflik Kepentingan if written in Bahasa).** This section is optional; you may remove it if it is not needed.

3. Figure Placement

All figures should be numbered with Arabic numerals (1, 2, 3,..). Every figure should have a caption. All photographs, schemas, graphs and diagrams are to be referred to as figures. Line drawings should be good quality scans or true electronic output. Low-quality scans are not acceptable. Figures must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. In MS word input the figures must be properly coded. Preferred formats of figures are PNG, JPEG, GIF etc. Lettering and symbols should be clearly defined either in the collage or in a legend provided as part of the figure. Figures should be placed at the top or bottom of a page wherever possible, as close as possible to the first reference to them in the paper. Please ensure that all the figures are of 300 DPI resolutions as this will facilitate good output. The figure number and caption should be typed below the illustration in 8 pt and left justified [Note: one-line captions of length less than column width (or full typesetting width or oblong) centered]. 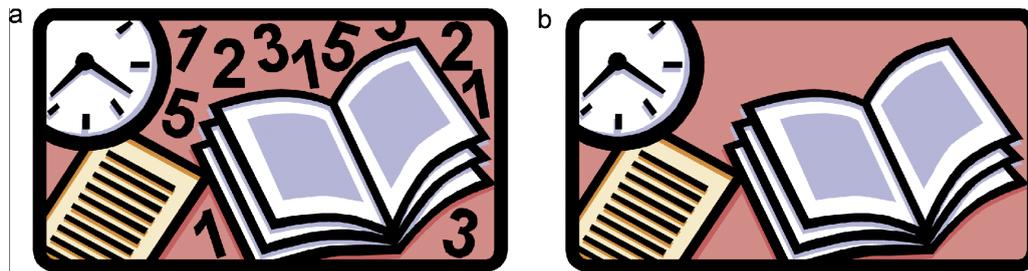


Figure1. (a) first picture; (b) second picture.

3. Equations

Acknowledgements and Reference heading should be left justified, bold, with the first letter capitalized but have no numbers. The text below continues as normal.
