

Making docs ok for new users (show to a friend scenario): main problems/goals:

- How to setup saving
- Clear and easy-to-find markup docs
 - Findable cheatsheet
- Make them know there are extensions (in the setup tiddler as well?)
- Plugins, InstallingPlugins and ManuallyInstallingPlugins
- WhatsNew tiddler, remove from default tiddlers (for now; may be updated later)
- Awakening tiddler
- Limit TabTimeline 100
- UnaMesa :
 - Remove from MainMenu, check with Jeremy
 - Setup small version of TiddlyWiki History (merge there Osrosoft, UnaMesa and History tiddlers)

Improving docs for seasoned users: main problems/goals/questions:

- Create a survey

Infrastructure: how to make contributing simple:

- [plugin to annotate EditTemplate and New Tiddler]
- What to explain in guidelines for contributors (see also [that for TW5](#)):
 - Editing (suggesting) via github is not as simple as in a local TW and here's how you do it: ...
 - [adding/deleting/renaming tiddlers and split.recipe]
 - Link the ↓ thing (so that it's easier to get how to write well)
- Create "Improving Documentation"
- Avoid CamelCase
- Suggest -> Issue
- "If you're not comfortable making pull request" -> Google Group
