- **Saturday & Sunday, September 27-28, 2025**, with optional extra prep and play Friday and Monday.
- The main event is on Saturday and Sunday, but why not come for extra practice time on Friday and stay until Monday afternoon?

Prerequisites: At a minimum, you are an intermediate – advanced canoeist, who might have been tripping for years, tandem or solo. You'd like to be even more efficient and smooth and learn some functional paddling (with a little flair thrown in). You might also be an [ORCKA Level 4 paddler with CSP1a/b \(solo or tandem\)](#) certification; [Paddle Canada Lake Canoeist](#) or [Intro Canadian Style Paddler](#); an Intermediate [American Freestyle Flatwater Paddler](#); or equivalent.

Questions about your level? Please, just ask! 😊 Through fun and sharing, this event will make you an even better paddler.

Activities include:


- Slalom/English gate challenges

Guided by Kōrero, AI designed to help people reflect deeply on their relationship with place at [Native-Land.ca – Our Home on Native Land](#):

"As a visitor here, I paddle and rest on the ancestral lands of the Anishinabewaki, Haudenosaunee, Attiwayonwronk (Neutral), and Mississauga peoples, including the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. This glacial lake and remnant Carolinian forest sustained life for millennia—winter fishing, medicines, and treaties still alive today.

As a paddler here, I commit to stewarding this place by cleaning, learning, and teaching others. I will amplify Indigenous voices, stencil the Moccasin Identifier on boats, and confront the injustice of displacement. Let every stroke on this water be a prayer of gratitude and a step toward reciprocity."
