Hero of the week- Everyone involved in the Summer Party.

On Monday the Leeds Ball was cancelled which was devastating for everyone, especially those who had spent up to 10 months working on the event. The Ball was completely remodelled this year and had landed incredibly well with students, selling out for the first time since covid and with over a month to spare.

Although it would have been understandable for the team to be disheartened by this, they instead threw themselves into completely re-organising every aspect of the event so that it could be accommodated within the building. This included ensuring every Ball ticket holder received a full refund alongside a voucher to book a free ticket for the replacement Summer Party. The reaction from students was incredible with 3700 of the original 4000 Ball ticket holders re-booking for the Summer Party (topped up by 300 from the Ball waiting list)

and a drop off in attendance of only 10% which is incredibly low for a free event.

Students seemed to really appreciate the work that had gone into ensuring they still had a fantastic way to celebrate the end of the year and in many cases their time in Leeds. Everyone came dressed to impress and fully bought into everything the Summer Party had to offer. None of this would have been possible without the dedication and professionalism of the team that worked tirelessly last week to ensure that not only an event could take place but that it was of such an incredibly high standard.

Thanks to everyone involved – you really did ensure that students loved their time at Leeds!
