One year ago, Arbor View stood yards away from the top, only to watch Coronado snatch the glory away. A season defined by dominance ended in heartbreak. The Aggies never lost their determination—just shifted it into something sharper. And now the only thing that matters... is redemption.

That championship teams don't just dominate... they evolve.

And Arbor View stood their ground. The second half of the season was different. The noise quieted. The game slowed down. They found their rhythm. The defense locked in—disruptive and disciplined. The offense? Unstoppable. The Aggies began overwhelming teams with pace, power, and precision. With every snap, their identity took shape. With every win, confidence surged. Led by a relentless core—Jayda Emil, Danielle Morales, and Kaylinn Foss—the Aggies started looking like contenders again. Not just chasing redemption… but ready to seize it.

The team was back at their top form, looking unstoppable to other teams, but the hardest matchup was yet to come. January 17th. A game that was circled on every calendar: Arbor View vs. Coronado. The rematch, with both teams at the apex of their strength. The Aggies came into the matchup undefeated in league play and hungry for revenge after the last-minute state title

loss from the year before. This time, Arbor View didn't blink as they made a statement against the Cougars on their home field, running away with a 25-19 victory and proving to the rest of the league that the Aggies were back and ready to win.

But beating Coronado? It wasn't enough. The real test was yet to come. The playoffs. Where the pressure separates the top teams from everyone else."

With a dominant finish, the Aggies secured the 1-seed... and with it, a first-round bye. But rest? That wasn't an option. Every practice mattered, polishing the small details, making sure nothing got in their way

(PLAYOFF GAME VS. LEGACY—SHOTS OF TOUCHDOWNS, DEFENSIVE PLAYS, FINAL SCORE: 53-15.)

Legacy put up a fight, but in the end, never stood a chance, falling to a dominant Aggies performance in which they put up 50+ points for the first time all season in a 53-15 victory

In their toughest postseason test yet, the Aggies welcomed the Mojave Rattlers to their home turf. In the first half, the Aggies struggled to move the ball as Mojave's defense came with a game plan focused on shutting down the team's strengths. However, despite taking an early lead, the Rattlers would eventually succumb to Arbor's overwhelming rushing attack spearheaded by Dani Morales. In the end, the Aggies would prevail, winning 30-12 and heading to their second straight state title tilt.

The Aggies are determined to start it off strong. They knew that scoring first would give them the advantage they needed

The Aggies pushed through the drive first after winning the toss. They pushed forward with all their might, but in the end, the Aggies were forced to hand the ball over.

Behind the ball, the Aggies kept the pressure for the rest of the drive. Forcing the offense to settle for a few yards a play. In the end, the Falcons pushed up the field and into the endzone. The Falcons have started with the lead.

But the Aggies were not willing to stop there; every single play, every single down, the ladies kept composed and scored, obtaining a lead in the second quarter, 7-6.

But the Aggies were not going to end the half being down; they pushed down the field, and with 4 minutes remaining, they scored, going into the half up 14-12

The Falcons have scored with only 1 minute remaining in the game.

A last-chance, desperation drive was not enough. As the clock struck 0, the Aggies found themselves once again watching as another team celebrated a championship.

Despite the loss, the Aggies are proud of what they have accomplished while also making friends and family on the way. Playing at Allegiant Stadium was a highlight of their career that they took in stride. The Aggies made history and, in the end, cemented their legacy at Arbor View.
