Note: Students who did not take tech in grade nine must take a tech in grade 10. One credit in Arts and Phys Ed are required for graduation. We recommend completing these requirements if they were not taken in grade 9.

- 1. **Regular Program:** 6 compulsory courses (2 are half credits) + 3 elective courses = 8 credits
- 2. **CELP:** 4 credit CELP bundle + 3 compulsory courses + 1 elective course = 8 credits
- 3. French Immersion: 7 compulsory courses (2 are half credits) + 2 elective courses = 8 credits
- 4. **APP:** 6 compulsory courses (2 are half credits) + 2 APP + 1 elective courses = 8 credits

Pathway Information: Grade 10 course selection

In grade 10 the compulsory course of study is no longer de-streamed or single-streamed. Students must select either Academic or Applied compulsory courses. Elective courses in grade 10 remain open courses. The course type is indicated by the 5th character in the course code. For example, ENG2D is an Academic course; MFM2P is an Applied course; ADA2O is an Open course.

Pathway and Course choice:

Students must meet the educational requirements of their chosen trade. As most trades require apprentices to pass a series of examinations administered at an Ontario college, academic readiness is extremely helpful. Recommendations for students on this pathway may include grade 12 Mathematics and English (College, Mixed or University type courses) and courses directly related to or which support relevant learning in the sector the student wishes to pursue. Many course choices can support an Apprenticeship pathway.

Students who wish to attend college must graduate from secondary school with ENG4C or ENG4U. There are very few specialized programs that may accept a student who has taken workplace courses (ENG4E). Additional requirements may exist depending on the post-secondary program of choice. Students interested in science or technician programs may need MCT4C or MAP4C; SBI3C, SCH4C or SPH4C. Please explore programs to identify the specific admission requirements for programs you are interested in. Grade 10 courses provide the prerequisites for grade 11 and 12 courses. Open level courses do not require a prerequisite. Please check the Norwell course calendar for prerequisite information.

Students wishing to enter a university program must complete grade 12 having achieved a minimum of six grade 12 courses of Mixed or University type (4M or 4U). All university programs require ENG4U + 5 additional 4M/4U courses. Admission requirements vary depending on the specific program of choice. For example, a Bachelor of Science will require ENG4U, MHF4U and 2 of SBI4U/SCH4U/SPH4U + 2 additional 4M/4U courses. Please explore programs to identify the specific admission requirements for programs you are interested in. Grade 10 courses provide the prerequisites for grade 11 and 12 courses. Open level courses do not require a prerequisite. Please check the Norwell course calendar for prerequisite information.
