	Set up the video to watch. Students seated on the floor.

5 mins	Introduction:	
	Introduce the topic - Around the House 2 This time with 'Around the House', our signs	
	relate to the bathroom and laundry. All our	
	bathrooms and laundries will differ, but many will	
	have the same items in them, so these are the	
	signs that we've chosen for this lesson.	
	Some people love the bathroom and so, many families have a 'bathroom hog', someone who is	
	always in the bathroom! Who is your family	
	bathroom hog? Your brother or sister, or perhaps	
	it's you! If you're lucky you might have 2 bathrooms, so it's	
	If you're lucky you might have 2 bathrooms, so it's easier to share, or you might have 2 basins and a	
	large mirror. Whatever your bathroom or laundry	
	is like, we really need them in our homes to clean	
	ourselves and our clothing.	
	Learn and practise the signs and maybe you could describe your own bathroom(s) using	
	Auslan.

	 Check for understanding, clarifying 	
	vocabulary as necessary.

	of the machine etc		
	 The washing machine is finished. Hang 		
	items on the clothesline.		
	 One student can do the actions 		
	(Constructed Action) and the other can		
	provide an Auslan narration of what's		
	happening. Students could swap roles for		
	the Laundry then the Clothesline scenes.
