Transportation

Air

Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport (Main Airport)

Address: 2400 Aviation Dr, Dallas, TX 75261

Details: Locals will refer to it as DFW, and it serves as the main hub of air travel for the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex. The airport is situated slightly north of the metroplex and is halfway between the two main cities (we call this area the Mid-Cities). The airport is near Grapevine, Texas, even if the address is Dallas, Texas, and is a 30–45-minute drive to the SMU campus. All international flights and American will fly into DFW. Alaska Airlines and Delta fly into both DFW and Love Field.

Dallas Love Field (Domestic Flights)

Address: 8008 Herb Kelleher Way

Details: Love Field is a destination for Alaska, Delta, and Southwest flights. Love Field is closer to the SMU campus (10-20 minutes) than the DFW International Airport.

- Day Pass 6\$

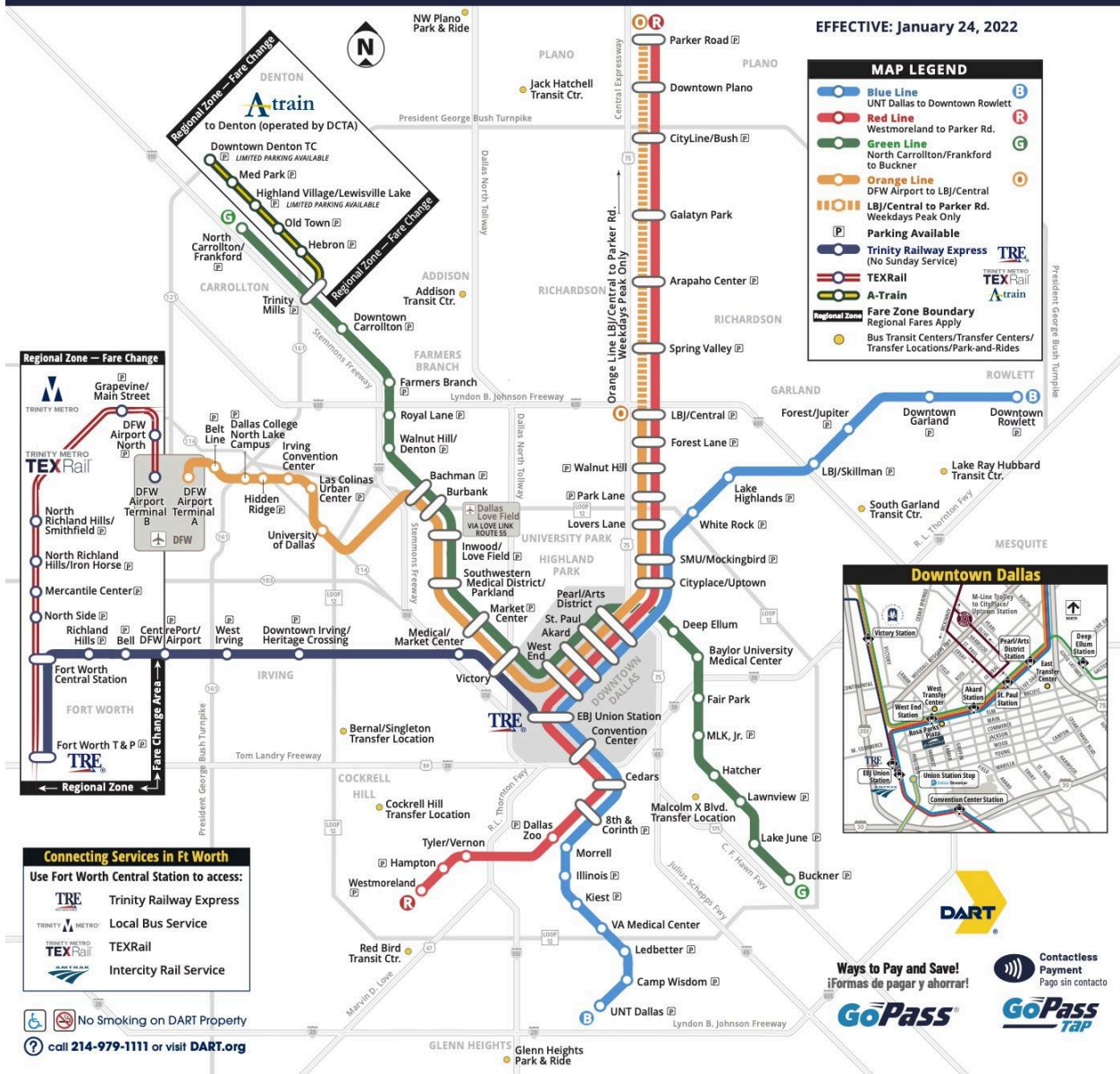
- o All Day Passes are valid for unlimited rides on the date of purchase only through 3 a.m. the following day.
- Am/PM pass
 - o A pass purchased or activated before noon is an AM Pass & will be valid from the start of service until noon. A pass purchased or activated after noon is a PM Pass and will be valid from noon until the end of service.
- Midday Pass
 - o Pass that allows unlimited travel between 9:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. seven days a week.

Rail/Bus

Dallas Area Rapid Transit's (DART) Love Link bus (Route 55) operates between Dallas Love Field airport and Inwood/Love Field rail station, providing connections to the DART Green and Orange rail lines. The Love Link picks up passengers from either far end of Ground Transportation on the lower level. Take the Orange line (To LBJ/Central) to Mockingbird station.

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Shuttle from Mockingbird Station to Campus

SMU partners with the DART system to run two routes through/around campus. Route 440 (Red Shuttle) will pick up at the Mockingbird station and will drop off riders in the middle of campus. Route 442 (Blue Shuttle) will pick up at SMU-East Campus and drop off riders around the campus. The drop-off at Hillcrest/University will be the closest stop to The Lumen.

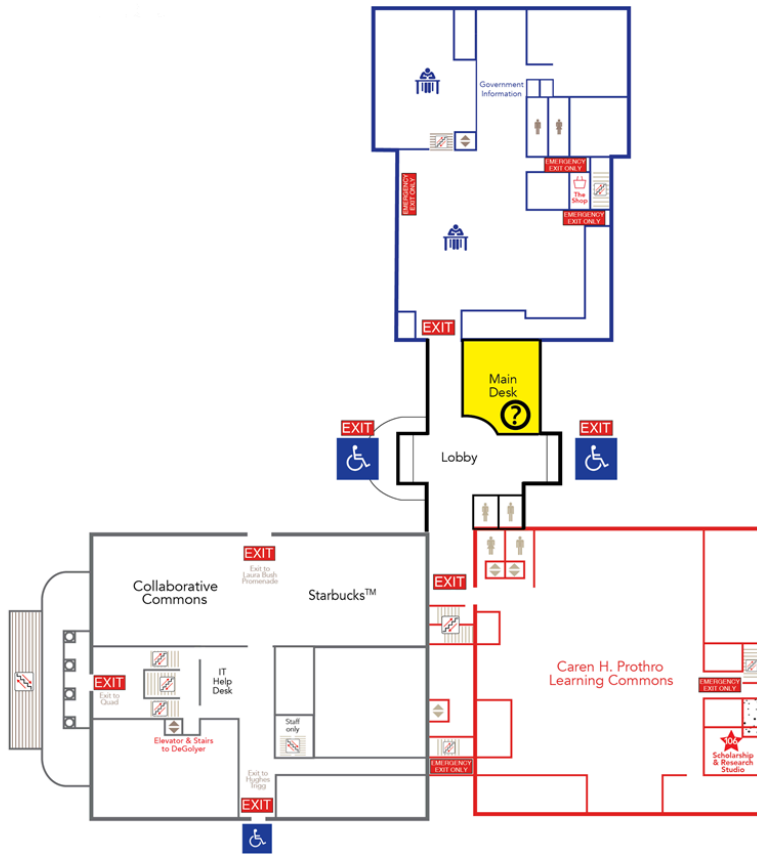

The Visa Waiver Program (VWP) enables most citizens or nationals of participating countries to travel to the United States for tourism or business for stays of 90 days or less without obtaining a visa. Travelers must have a valid Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA) approval prior to travel and meet all requirements explained below. If you prefer to have a visa in your passport, you may still apply for a visitor (B) visa.

Dallas Neighborhood Breakdown

- Park Cities
 - o Made up of Highland Park and University Park. They are technically considered separate towns from Dallas. Southern Methodist University is in the Park Cities.
- Lower Greenville
 - o A strip of popular restaurants and bars (including rooftop bars with views of Downtown).
- Oak Lawn
 - o Historic LGBTQ neighborhood of Dallas
- Uptown
 - o Same as Lower Greenville but in Uptown
- Design District
 - o Section of town populated by restaurants, art galleries, and furniture shops.
- Downtown
 - o Location of the infamous Texas Book Depository and the John F. Kennedy assassination site
- Deep Ellum
 - o The traditional hipster district of Dallas has good restaurants, bars, and music venues. You can find a concert going on every night.
- Bishop Arts District
 - o District of restaurants, boutiques, shops, and the independent Texas Theatre

- Fair Park/ South Dallas
 - Location of the Texas State Fair
- The Cedars
 - Home to one of Dallas's biggest breweries Four Corners Brewing Co.
- West Dallas
 - Historic African American and Latino neighborhoods. Also, the neighborhood where Bonnie and Clyde got their start.
- Lakewood/White Rock Lake
 - Great place for biking, running, or boating on White Rock Lake

Suburbs of Note

- Richardson
 - One of the best foodie cities in Texas and one of the most ethnically diverse areas in the DFW metroplex.
- Plano
 - Typical Dallas suburb
- Frisco
 - Home of FC Dallas and the National Soccer Hall of Fame
- Addison
 - More restaurants per capita than in any city in Texas.
- Arlington
 - Home of the Dallas Cowboys, Texas Rangers, North Texas SC as well as Mariano (where the frozen margarita machine was invented). There is also a theme park and water park.
- Denton
 - Cool college town north of Dallas with a thriving music scene (due to a well-known music school at the University of North Texas). Immortalized by the Mountain Goats' The Best Ever Death Metal Band Out of Denton.
- Fort Worth
 - Fort Worth is the historic center of the Texas livestock trade. When people think of Texas cowboys and rodeos, they are thinking of Fort Worth.
 - The Stockyards
 - Amon Carter Museum of American Art
 - Cowgirl Museum
 - Fort Worth Zoo (USA Today calls it the 2nd best zoo!)
 - Fort Worth Water Gardens
