 - Senator Wiener's focus in the next year: criminal justice and policing reform,
 Bradford decertification, decrim of sex work, decarceration, housing, legalizing safe injection sites, mental health, fracking ban,
 - b. Q: Wildfires? Need more resources for CalFire. On inmate firefighters, pipeline for inmate to firefighter once released from prison. Long-term, need to change where housing expansion is going, large numbers of new housing are in wildfire
 - c. Q: how do we close the housing gap? There needs to be priority of housing. Zoning reform, increase funding for affordable housing. Protections for renters.
 - d. Q: how can UCGPC be a partner with legislation? Has worked with UCSA. The key is to have a presence. Having someone to monitor bills of interest, and build relationships with legislators.
 - e. Q: how do we make sure new housing is affordable and equitable? We need to remove zoning laws such that CA has land that can allow multi-unit housing.
 - f. Q: how do we stay on track for our renewable energy and environment goals? The biggest piece is personal vehicles, which is a result of our terrible housing plans. The grid, electric cars, and all those are important, but personal vehicles are the biggest contributor to our lack of progress.
