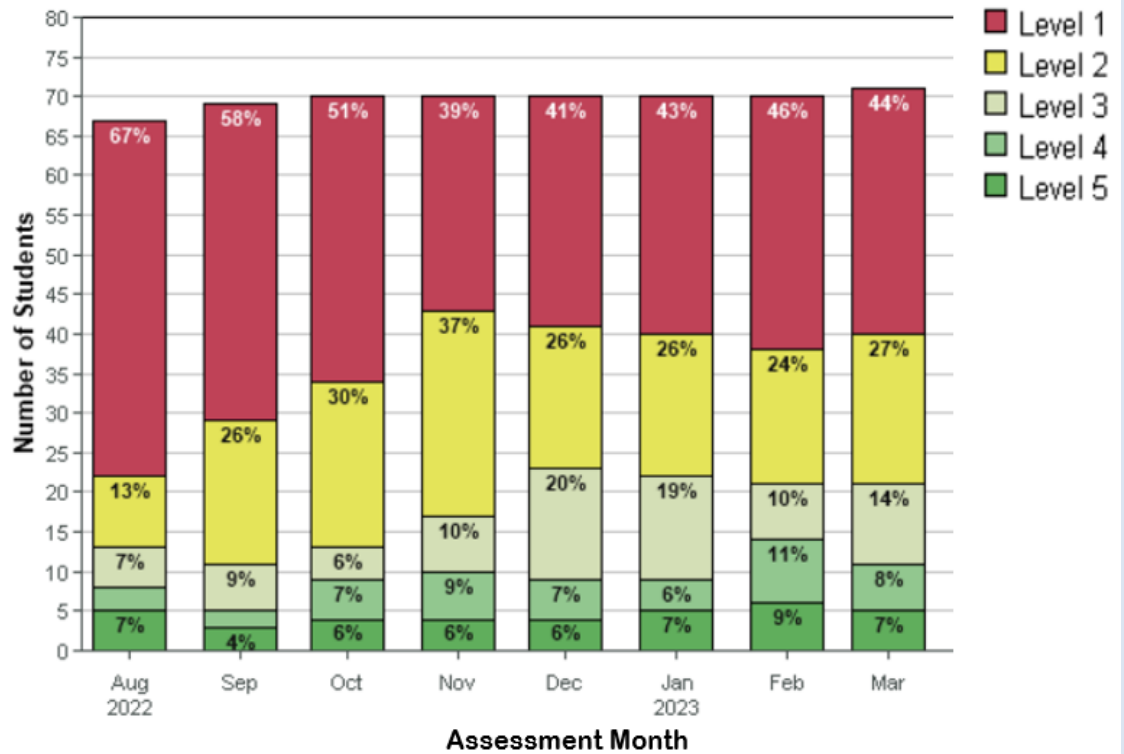

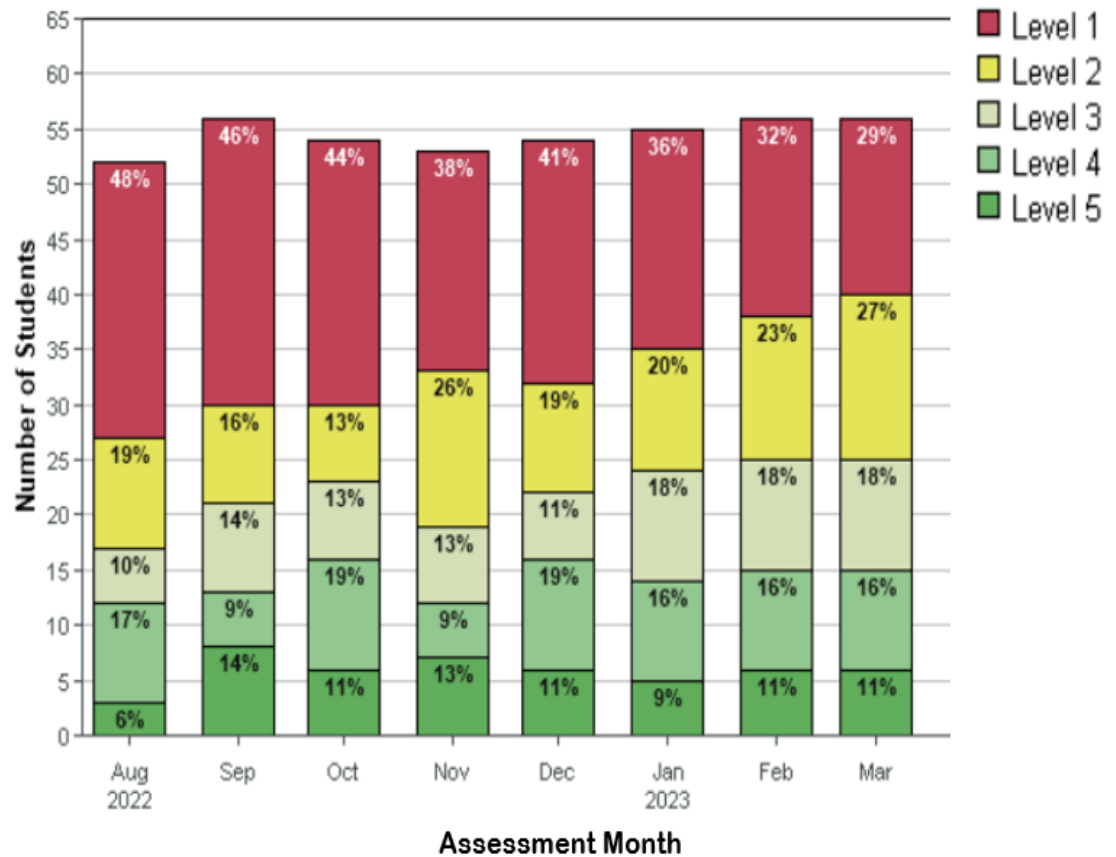
Parkview Elementary Istation Reading Data August 2022-March 2023



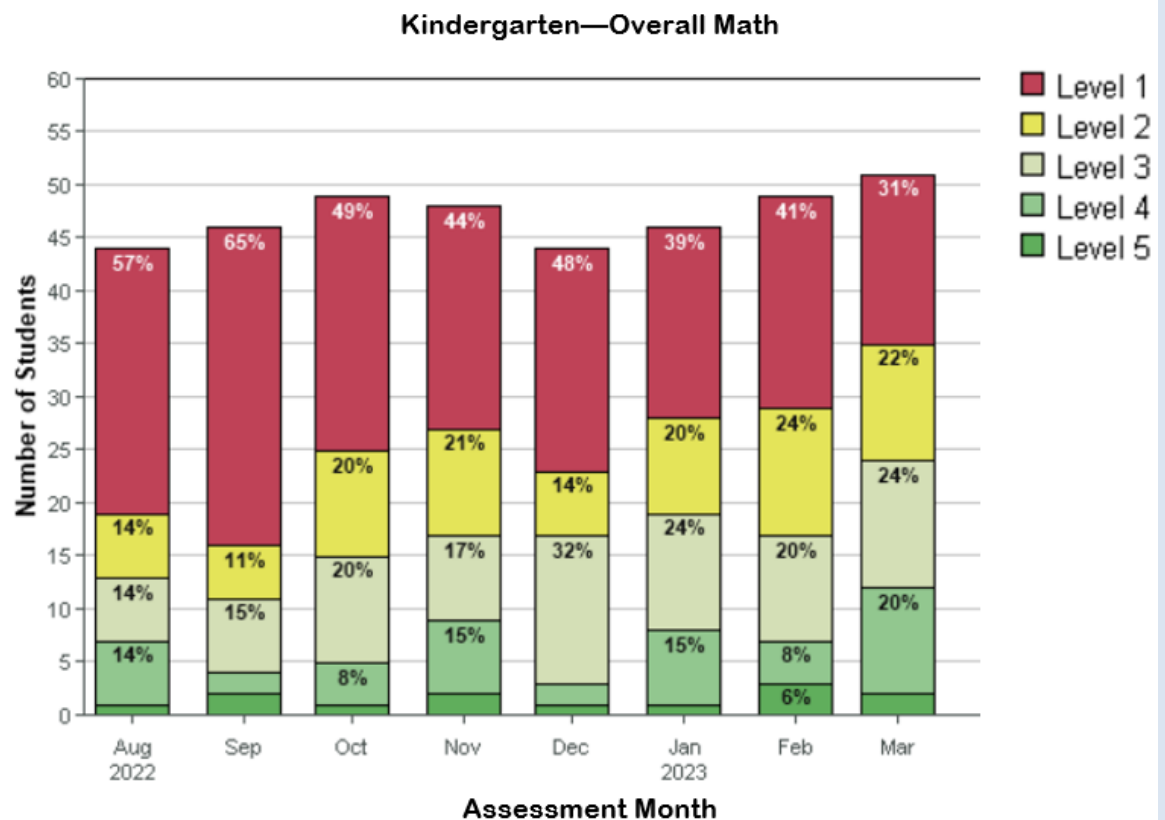
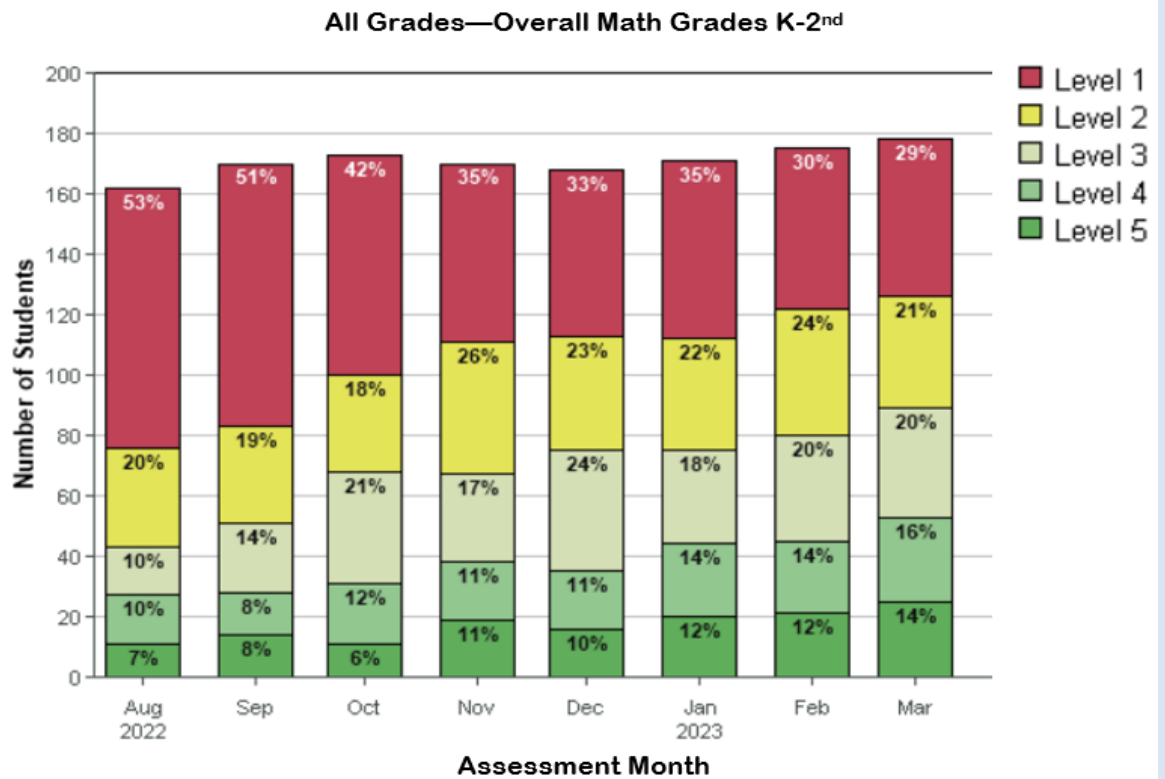
1st Grade—Overall Reading



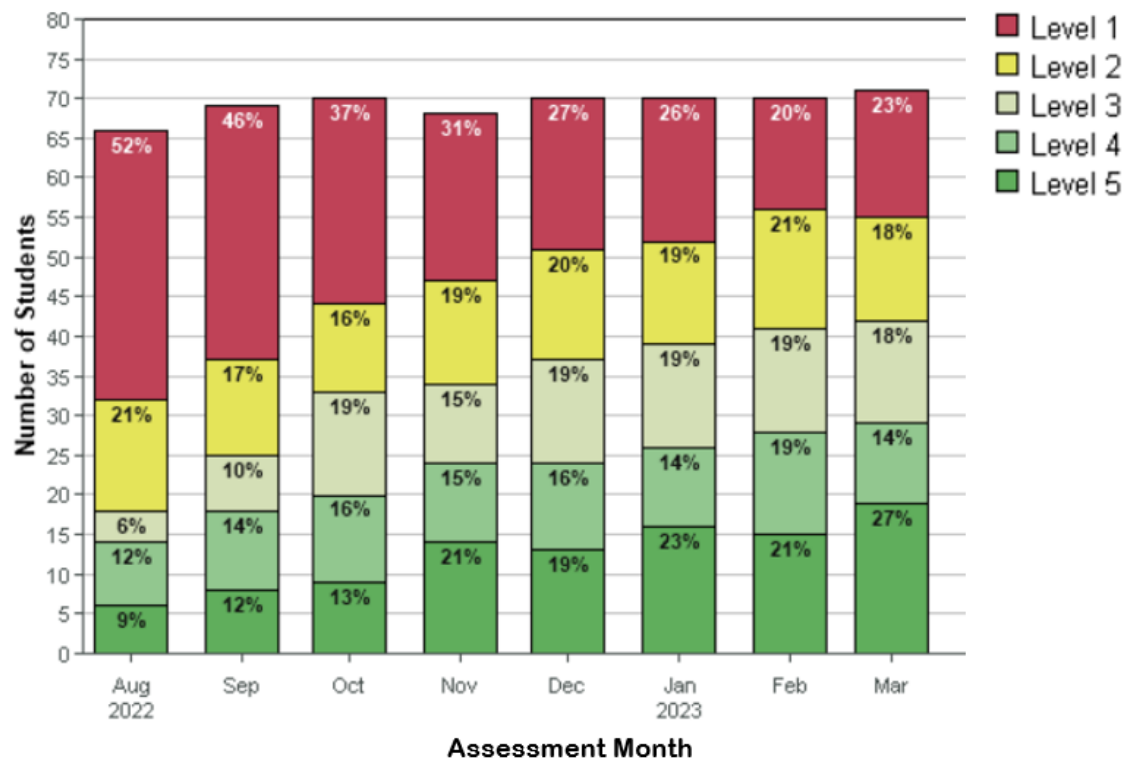
2nd Grade—Overall Reading



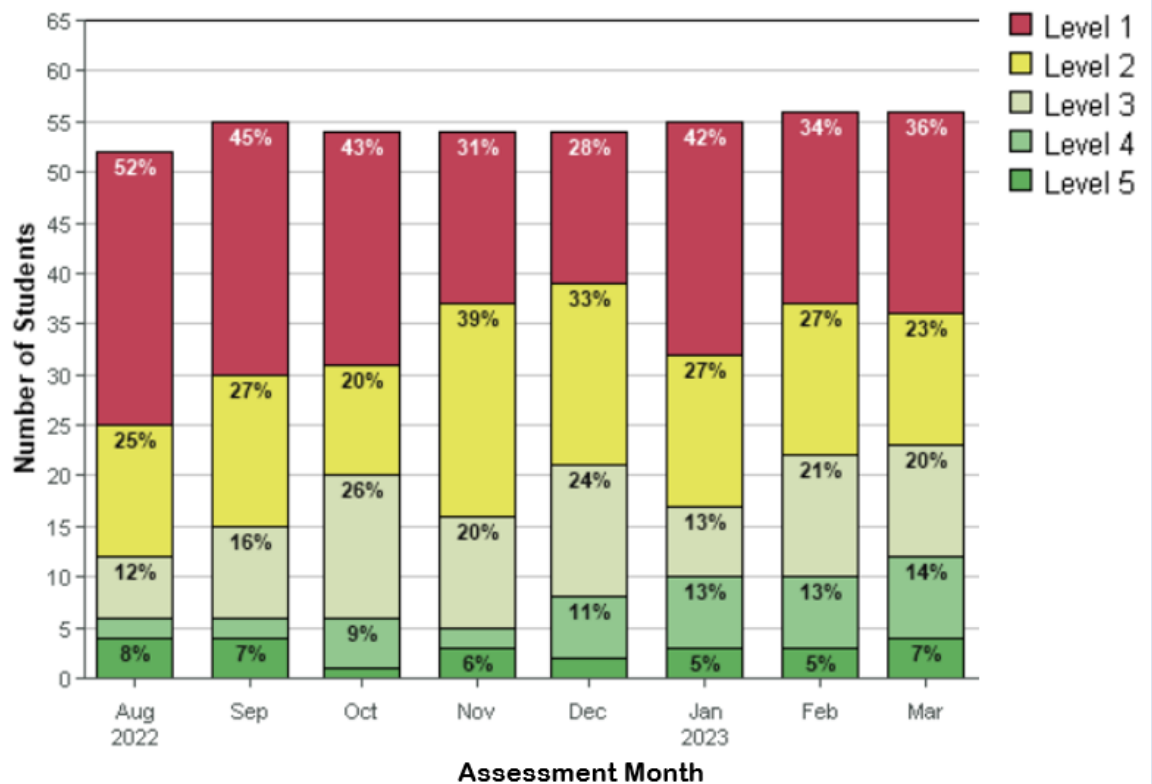
Parkview Elementary Istation Math Data August 22- March 23



1st Grade—Overall Math

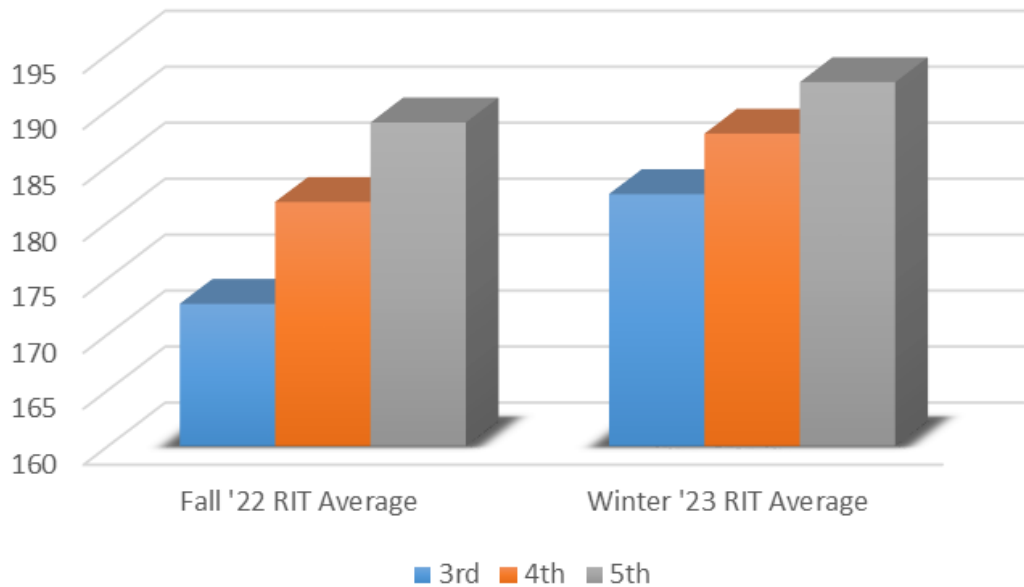


2nd Grade—Overall Math



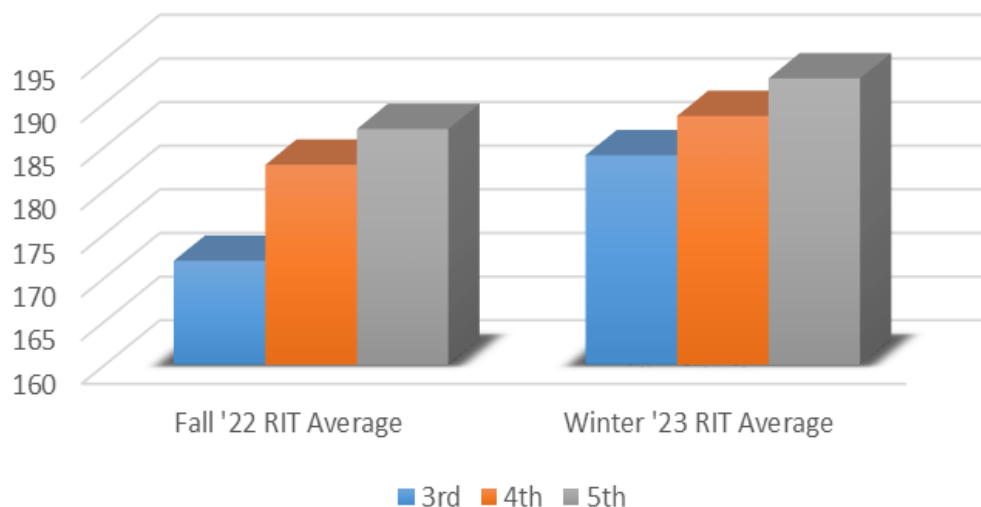

Grade Reading RIT Scores**



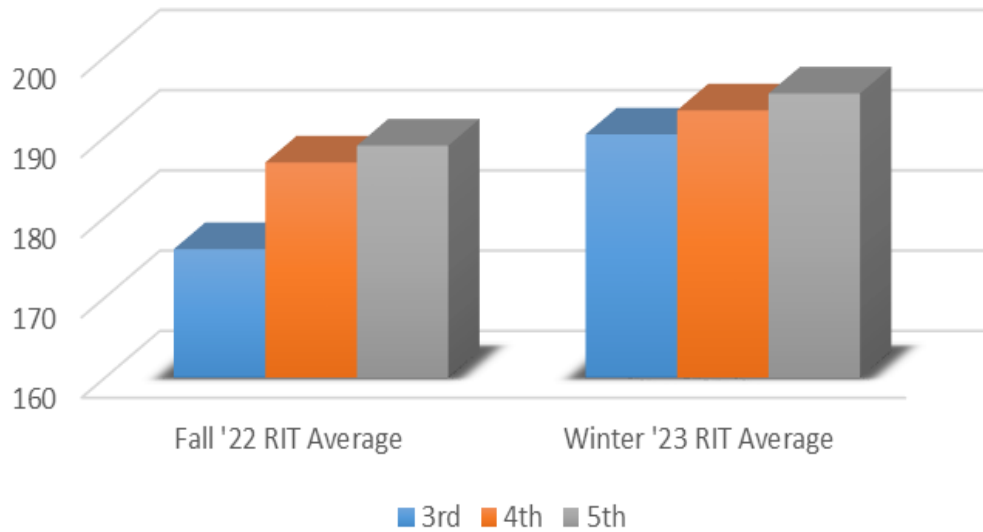

Curriculum & Instruction Update	● On Wednesday, March.1, 2023, we had an All-Staff Meeting to relay information about Upcoming Events, Expectations, Team Challenges & Successes. ● Grades K-3 are continuing to work with our Literacy Coach, Patricia Essig. She comes to us from Gallup, NM. She is traveling to Socorro, three days per week, to work with our K-3 teachers on teaching “structured literacy.” ● Kaylee Orr, our CORE Coach is also continuing to visit our school, monthly, to help teachers work with our special needs students. ● Our counselor, Ms. Herrera now has a Counselor’s Corner in our monthly newsletter. She shares the topics of her classes for each grade level, and she also shares about Dr. Wilks’ “Mindfulness” classes throughout the semester. ● Some of our K-3 teachers have completed their LETRS training and some are continuing with their LETRS training. LETRS(Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling) training is a scientifically-based, structured literacy training that will help them with their English language arts instruction. This is the first year that our third grade teachers will start their LETRS training. ● Our K-3 teachers are engaging in FUNDATIONS training. This program goes hand-in-hand with our LETRS training, and will allow these teachers to focus deeply on phonics, to help our students learn to read. We are working to include our Educational Fellows in this training, as well. ● We have a few fourth graders who are struggling with reading. They have been working with “Sound Partners.” Sound Partners is a supplemental reading program that Kim Schaffer and Kate Burleigh have both used at CVCS to help struggling readers. The program works by pairing a student with a volunteer (Kim or Kate) tutor for a 30-minute tutoring session. In the Sound Partners program, growth is measurable (students are assessed at regular intervals). ● We have been having attendance intervention meetings with students’ parents, trying to figure out ways to help the parents realize how important it is to get their children to school. We have seen an uptick in our attendance with these meetings, and we hope that this will continue.

	● On Wed., April 19, 2023, we will be having our Virtual AVID Site Meeting at 3:10pm. ● The Performing Art Series will be having a Magic/Illusion Show with Jason Bishop for our 4th and 5th graders on Thursday, Feb. 23, 2023. ● On Feb. 28th and March 1st, our students who have qualified to take part in the District Level Declamation Contest will be competing at Sarracino Middle School. ● Our Spring Break will take place during the week of March 13-16, 2023. School resumes on Monday, March 20. ● Our Spring Book Fair will be taking place from Monday-Friday, March 27-31st. ● Our Parent-Teacher Conferences will be taking place on Friday, Mar. 31st.
Parent / Community Involvement	● Our After School and Friday program with the Rio Grande Educational Collaborative (RGECE) is continuing. They provide free childcare and homework help for students. The district provides bussing for this program and our cafeteria provides snacks/meals for this program. ● Ms. Mary Edwina Yalnaty is continuing to supervise the NM TECH mentors with the MATCH program. This program takes place after school, to mentor and provide homework help for our third & fourth graders who enroll and qualify. ● Christopher Hathaway, the new Rugby Coach at NM TECH, had Rugby Outreach Clinics at Parkview on Feb. 21, 22, 28 and Mar. 1st. These clinics were held after school for 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. The students learned about Rugby fundamentals and teamwork. ● We had our Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) meeting on Wednesday, March. 8, 2023, starting at 6pm. This was held virtually, to make it easier for our parents to attend. We discussed upcoming events and ways that parents could help out with them. We also asked our parents for ideas on ways that they would like to assist our school. ● We are pleased to be a part of the Foster Grandparents Program through the County of Socorro. We have two “Grandmas” who come to assist on our campus. Grandma Rosemary is in Ms. Chavez’s first grade classroom and Grandma Rosie is in Ms. Wills’ kindergarten. ● On March 2, 2023 Parkview Post went home to parents and was posted on Facebook, (See picture below.)

Two of our students, Lucky Munireddy and Avynlee Ulibarri earned third place trophies and they will be going on to County Level Declamation in Magdalena. See pictures below. - We are consistently working hard to spread an attitude of positivity at Parkview. Each morning, Ms. Ocampo spreads a positive message on the intercom when she shares the morning message with the Pledge of Allegiance and Salute to the Flag of the State of New Mexico. She picks a positive word for the day to talk about, and challenges the students and staff to use it throughout the day. Recently, some of her positive words for January have included: Exceptional, Encouragement and Well-Being. Ms. Sarah Wheeler, our school library assistant, won a Cricut Machine in Karin Trujillo's library contest in the Fall! We congratulate her, and we see that she is using it already, in her library! - Parkview had 63 students with perfect attendance in February 2023! - Our 3rd graders celebrated their learning with a "food truck lunch" being delivered for them at Sedillo Park, across the street from the school.
