Important Notes

- Students must be residents of Lake Park High School District 108.
- Students should check with their counselor to determine which course(s) to register for.
- The credit recovery courses are offered to students who need to retake a class to earn credit. Students can not take a class for the first time to work ahead in summer.

Credit Recovery

- Students signing up for credit recovery must take the class during the semester they did not pass. For example, if you fail 1st semester during the regular school year you must take 1st semester in summer.
- All credit recovery classes will run depending on enrollment. If numbers are low, students
 will be placed in Edgenuity (an internet-based computer software program) to earn the
 credit. Students will not earn a grade-replacement for credit recovery since it's a pass/fail
 class.

Senior Enrichment

 Civics in Action and Consumer Education will be the only courses offered for advancement. These courses are limited to incoming seniors only.

Student Expectations

- Academic dishonesty in any form will result in a loss of credit for the assignment or assessment. A second incident will result in the student being withdrawn from the course without a refund and loss of credit.
- Students must abide by the expectations of the <u>Lake Park Student Handbook</u>. Students
 will be withdrawn if any inappropriate behavior causes a major disruption or poses a
 safety concern to the learning environment.

Attendance Policy

Students are expected to attend and engage in class every day since the semester is only 14 days long. Any students who miss more than 2 days will be dropped from the course without a refund. Students late to school will be marked tardy, which will count as a half-day absence.

A refund will not be issued if students fail the course or miss more than 2 days during a semester. Students will need to complete classroom activities, assignments, and assessments by the end of the semester. An extension will not be given to students past the last day of class.
