Competition Procedures

About the Case Competition

IYPC has ONE case for all competitors. Competitors will receive the case on March 11th, and have 24 hours to research, record, and present their case on their own time. The presentation time limit is 20 minutes, however, it is not necessary to fill up the entire presentation time slot.

Competitors may share and present a slide presentation or a PowerPoint. The case is open-book, and research is encouraged. However, citations are necessary, and plagiarism will be heavily scrutinized.

Teams of 1-3 are permitted. If you are interested in forming a team, but the rest of your team members have not yet registered, you are still eligible to compete. Please contact info@sqproject.org for all inquiries.

IYPC's case competition will have prizes for first place (\$300), second place (\$200), and third place (\$100). Runner-ups will receive product prizes. After presentations have received judging, winners will be released through an official Awards Ceremony on March 18th.
