**Instructional Routine to
Introduce a New Word: Sample**

Word: rest

1. Pronounce the word. Have students pronounce the word. Write the word to read. Talk about syllables, morphemes, spelling, part of speech, and etymology.

- Say the word a few times: *rest, rest, rest* - it has one syllable with a short vowel sound and a blend at the end.
- "This word is used as a noun here, but it can be a verb in other contexts too. Example: *I often rest on the couch with my puppy, Tashy.*"
- "This is a very old word, beginning with Old English but influenced by French, Latin, and other languages. Because it is so old, it has hundreds of definitions! You probably think of rest as what you do when you sleep, as in 'take a rest.' We're looking at another way to use rest."
