### Find

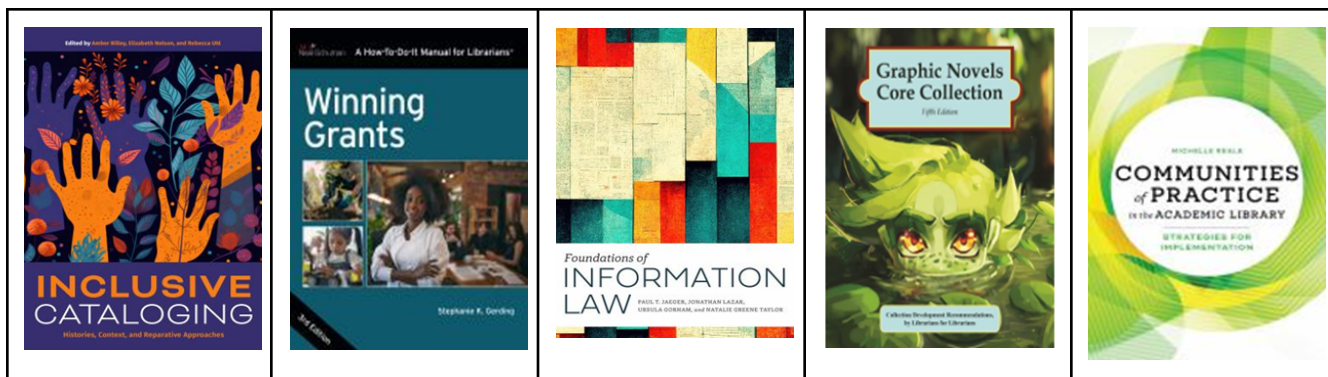
There are three ways to find or discover books in the collection. All start on the [landing page of the State Library's catalog](#).

### Sampling of Recent Additions

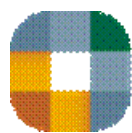
