Background Information

The first white settlers were granted land in what is now Novi 1824. They mostly came from the New York Counties of Ontario, Seneca and Wayne. Prior to this the land was occupied by the Patowatami, Odawa and Ojibwe tribes. Thomas Pinkerton and William Yerkes in early 1825 were the first white settlers in the region. Other settlers include John Gould, Pitts Taft, Joseph Eddy, Erastus Ingersoll, Benjamin Bently, Timothy Forles, NC. Prentiss, Cornelius Davis, Robert McKinney, Samuel Hungerford, and David A. Simmons. Many arrived between 1825 and 1827. In 1830 the inhabitants gathered to choose a name and petition a separation from Farmington. The name Novi was put forward by Mrs. Dr. J.C. Emery and her husband brought the name forward on her behalf. Other names considered include Republic and Benlake. There was a vote and "Novi" came out victorious. Residents claimed they wanted something short and easy to write. It was sent to the legislature for approval, and despite a complaint by Mr. James Kingsly of Ann Arbor who mistakenly believed Novi meant "Unknown" or "Forgotten" in Latin, the name Novi was approved. The First Church was the Baptist Church at Novi Corners, The First school was built at the Pitts Taft property, First Post Office was in the Home of John Gould in 1828. The first plank road was built by Erastus Ingersoll, The second plank road was built in 1850 along an old military road that went from Detroit to Grand Haven The Railway was laid in 1871. The First Methodist Church was built in 1869, The First Town hall was built in 1876 and cost \$800 to build. In 1929 The Novi Volunteer fire Department was founded. In 1960 The Novi Library opened and was staffed by volunteers and in 1963 Dorothy Flattery was hired as Novi's first librarian. Finally, in 1969 - Novi incorporated as a City. Novi has since grown and is home to over 60,000 residents. There are 5 elementary schools, an upper elementary, a middle school, and one high school. The community also boasts many international and immigrant groups from around the world.

Drawer 1: General History Folders 1-2

General History Folder 1-Buildings and Historic Sites (1825-1875) (Note: this is a heading 3 Font)

Note: Contains Fragile Documents, Handle with Care

Description: Folder one contains many elements of Novi's early history in school projects, photographs and newspapers. With a mixture of subfolders that include geographical, history of early human settlements (Native tribes, pre-Colonial settlement), Colonial settlement and expansion of area, and cultural/lifestyle over time as Novi grew. Specific names of soldiers who served in the Civil War that were from Novi and Northville (MI) are listed in multiple pages in this folder.

General History Folder 2-Historic Buildings and Sites

Note: Many loose files, placed in subfolders to protect documents from tearing when being removed from the folder. May need reevaluation of what needs to be kept in physical form.

Description: Similar information is given in this folder as Folder 1. However, this folder also contains files describing various properties in Novi. Some images have been photocopied as these files seem to be replicas of the original documents. There are also files containing census information for the area. Many loose files. This folder also contains a spiral bound book of evaluation of the Fuerst Farmstead's property.

Drawer 1: General History Folders 3-4, Cemeteries

General History Folder 3- Cemeteries (1942, 1980, 1981-1995, 2010)

Note: Native Americans/Indigenous tribes are referred to as “Indian”. Some may find this label sensitive. Information listed using this label is not intended to offend but to show information as it was documented historically at the time. Also, there seems to be duplicate clippings of the same article (see ‘Description’), one is complete and one is not.

Description: This folder contains a sub-file “Indian Burial Grounds” that consists of one clipping of an incomplete article from 1980 discussing the discovery of burial sites that had no headstones, located North of 9 Mile Road. The next sub-files are labeled “Knapp Cemetery”, “Novi Cemetery”, and “S. White Cemetery”. Articles, photographic prints, cemetery inventory, newspaper clippings, letter from Novi’s Assistant City Manager give information regarding who is buried at these locations and various issues that arose over time at these sites such as missing headstones and their return to grave sites.

General History Folder 4- Cemeteries (and Cemetery Preservation)

Note: Not sure if this is a necessary folder.

Description: This folder only contains 3 vertical files. The first is a packet from the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War National Grave Registration Project print outs of website pages that list criteria, guidelines, program purpose, and also the layout of the website such as the home page and other areas of the site. The next file is a printed photocopy of the Northville Record listing the Honor Roll students from Northville, MI (3/15/1918). A specific name, Scott Dunham, is highlighted. The last vertical file in this folder is a printout of a PowerPoint presentation from the Historical Society of MI “Keeping Cemeteries Alive” (2/17/2017).

Description: This folder contains various still images of historical buildings in Novi. Some are laminated, others are uncovered. Many of the contents have dates and the artist’s signature (yet to be identified).

Drawer 1: Fuerst Farm Folder 1

Fuerst Farm Folder 1 (1827-1995) (Note: this is a heading 3 Font)

Note: Contents may need another review/evaluation, many loose files.

Description: First file is a print of a summary of the Fuerst Farmstead Est. 1827. There are multiple copies of the brochure, a couple of them complete, some are only one sided prints. There is also a progress report on the Fuerst Farmstead from 5/5/1995. 2 maps of the site are also located in this folder, along with many articles discussing the descendants (Iva and Ruby) taking care of the farm, legal troubles they faced, and the aftermath of what happened to the estate after their deaths. There is also a document requesting information on a World War 1 Veteran who may have been killed in action, Scott Dunham from 5/4/1995 and a memorandum, more articles, maps, and a proposal for preservation of Fuerst Farmstead.

Drawer 1: Grand River Bridge Folder 1

Grand River Bridge Folder 1 (1920s, 1988, 1992-1994)(Note: this is a heading 3 Font)

Description: This folder contains a sub-folder holding a *Novi News* clipping about the Grand River Bridge being replaced (5/28/1992). Another file gives a brief history of Grand River Ave. and the railroad industry that thrived where it was built. This document also has a few photographs of prominent buildings on Grand River Avenue. Next is an article from 12/8/1994 saying that the community is ready for the 1920s bridge to be replaced. Next, a record from Historical American Engineering discusses the Grand River Bridge. Finally, a formal document from the Bureau of History recommends that an archaeological survey be conducted around the site of construction (2-20-1988).

Drawer 1: (Miscellaneous) Historic Buildings and Sites Folder 1

(Miscellaneous) Historic Buildings and Sites Folder 1

Note: These may be able to be combined into other folders in General History or Cemeteries.

Description: Folder 1 contains 2 documents. The first is a copy of what appears to be a property deed for the S. White Burial Cemetery. The second is a memorandum for the Cornelius Austin House.

Drawer 1: Local History Column Folder 1

Local History Column Folder 1(1989-1991)

Note: Some articles are multiples.

Description: From looking through this folder, it appears to contain articles about local history in the Novi area from 1989 to 1991. Columns may have continued afterward and/or prior to these years, but these are held in the physical folder of the collection. The columns were written by then Local History Librarian of Novi Public Library, Barbara Louie.

Drawer 1: Lucy Needham Collection Folder 1

Note: Native Americans/Indigenous tribes are referred to as "Indian". Some may find this label sensitive. Information listed using this label is not intended to offend but to show information as it was documented historically at the time.

Description: This folder contains various documents pertaining to the History of Novi. The documents range from Novi Historical timetable (1622-1834), to documents discussing how the city got its name and why the area was chosen to settle. There are some disagreements on how Novi got its name. The folder also contains an interview with a long time resident of Novi that occurred in 1962.

Novi Township Folder 1

Note: Some files may need to be relocated to Churches and Religious Groups

Description: This folder contains a booklet of the 1970 Census of Population and Housing in Novi, various documents and articles pertaining to the Novi Town Hall (est. 1876), meeting minutes from October 1958-July 1960 for the local government in Novi. There are a few pamphlets discussing the building's history, as well as articles and reports about the building's relocation. 2 vertical files may need to be relocated as they pertain more to Churches and religious groups in Novi.

Drawer 1: Rodger's House Folder 1

Rodger's House Folder 1 (1981, 1987, 1991-1995)

Description: Folder 1 contains various newspaper clippings about the White Manor House becoming a restaurant in the 1980s and how it changed owners around 1992-1995. A photograph from the newspaper (7/20/1995) shows the new owners of the restaurant. The original owner's called it Home, Sweet Home and the name changed to the Novi Mansion Restaurant under the new management.

Drawer 1: Simmons House Folder 1

Simmons House Folder 1

Description: Folder 1 only consists of a single article called "Historic Home Watches over 10 Mile" (1/8/2004). The article discusses how the family who owns it has watched the town surrounding them change over the years.

Description: Folder 1 contains a single newspaper article called " Historic Home over 10 Mile", 1/8/2004

Drawer 1: Thornton House Folder 1

Thornton House Folder 1 (1988-1992)

Description: This folder contains documents and architectural designs of how Thornton house should be restored. Meeting minutes from 6/25/1990-8/23/1990 for the rescue team for the home. Lastly, articles showing plans for and the eventual project to move and preserve the house (1988-1992).

Drawer 1: Tollgate Farm Folder 1

Tollgate Farm Folder 1 (1963, 1988-1997)

Description: This folder contains meeting minutes for the Board of Appeals July 31-December 19, 1963. There are also multiple brochures for the Tollgate 4-H Education Center that was built in 1989. There is a copy of the layout of Tollgate, and articles chronicling its progress. Finally, there is an article about reviving the pond on site, and a booklet of Powerpoint slides (11/23/2011) about how Tollgate Farms evolved and how it is now owned by Michigan State University.

Drawer 1: Yerkes House Folder 1

Yerkes House Folder 1

Description: This folder contains many newspaper articles chronicling the efforts to save the house, its vacancy, a fire and eventual demolition of the site. Residents sought to get a historic plaque to commemorate the house, and a plan to rebuild (3/1/1990) is also discussed in this folder. The final item in this folder is an illustration of the Yerkes House when it was abandoned.

Drawer 1: Churches and Religious Groups, Church of the Holy Cross Folder 1

Church of the Holy Cross Folder 1 (1986-1987, 2001-2005) Folder 1

Description: This folder contains multiple news articles about the pastors of the congregation. The first discussed the goal to grow the congregation in 2005, and another from 2002. There were also articles about another pastor of the church, Father Harding, receiving the DSA of 1886 to build the church and then commemorating his 25 years of service to retiring after 28 years.

Drawer 1: Church Miscellaneous Folder 1

Church Miscellaneous Folder 1 (1980-1982,1986,1989-1991,1994-1996)

Description: This folder holds various documents, ranging from a list of churches in Novi and their phone numbers to articles about Reverend Vernon Douglas and Austen Denney. There is also a booklet called "How to Write a Local Church History" from the United Methodist Church General Commission on Archives and History (1996). Multiple documents pertain to Church Women United Northwest Suburban and a copy of the 'Novi Baptist Ladies' Cookbook'.

Drawer 1: Faith Community Presbyterian Church Folder 1

Faith Community Presbyterian Church Folder 1 (1978-1981, 1984-1986, 1989-1990, 2003)

Note: This folder's contents may need to be organized.

Description: This folder contains articles about pastors celebrating their anniversaries of service to the church, a final building report for the city, pieces of mail indicating holiday services for 1980 and a program called FUNDAY in 1981?. There is also an article about a new minister coming in and projects the church has as well as a "Year in Review 2003" and 1981 Annual Report.

Drawer 1: First Baptist Church Folder 1

First Baptist Church Folder 1 (1988-1990)

Note: Filed by date of item.

Description: This folder contains documents indicating Don Bauer trying to link his family to the founding for the First Baptist Church in Novi. There is also a church brochure and multiple articles about a Reverend Burgess. The last few articles discuss a minister preaching fitness, a new minister arriving, and the rise of homeschooled children in Novi (1990). Some of the families did notify the state, while others did not. Regardless, the church was a meeting spot for these families to gather.

Drawer 1: Good Shepherd Evangelical Church

Good Shepherd Evangelical Church Folder 1 (1981-1983, 1990-1991)

Note: Filed by date of item.

Description: This folder contains a piece of mail promoting a production put on by the church and introducing new pastor in 1981, an article about how the Novi Lutheran Church was looking to change its name in 1981, an article about a new site being selected to build a church in 1983, an article discussing the project being off schedule in 1990, and the chapel's completion in 1991.

Drawer 1: Holy Family Catholic Church

Holy Family Catholic Church Folder 1(1977, 1986-1989)

Description: Folder 1 contains a publication from the Sixth Gate Police Department (1977), a picture of Father O'Brien and accompanying articles about him as well. Some articles about Father O'Brien mention his leaving the church in the late 1980s. Lastly, there are clippings from the church newsletter and a full parish newsletter (2 copies).

Drawer 1: Meadowbrook Congregational Church

Meadowbrook Congregational Church Folder 1 (1981-1986, 1992)

Description: In this folder, there is a document declaring 6/6/1982 Ray Ferguson Day at Bushnell Congregational Church as well as articles about Robin Meyer and Reverend Neil Hunt. An illustration and headline saying Bushnell is moving to Novi in 1981. The final document is a picture of the steeple being placed on the newly built Meadowbrook Congregational Church.

Drawer 1: Novi United Methodist Church

Novi United Methodist Church Folder 1 (1950s, 1960s, 1969-1999)

Description: This folder contains a Church Christmas Program booklet as well as one for "The Service of Consecration", and various articles relating to the church (bakesale, Reverend Charles Jacobs, Celebrating 30 years in new building and 175 for the whole church). There is also a booklet of names and contact information of the congregation from the late 1950s and early 1960s.

Drawer 1: Methodist Church

Methodist Church Folder 2? (1992-1997)

Description: This folder contains various articles marking the ongoing project of trying to preserve the original church building or wrecking it. From 1992-1997, the progress is mapped by the articles. Finally the building was to be moved to 10 Mile and Taft in 1997 and be used as a Baptist Church.

Drawer 1: Spirit of Christ Church

Spirit of Christ Church Folder 1 (1986-1989)

Description: Folder 1 contains 3 articles about the Spirit of Christ Church from 1986-1989. There is also a picture from a newspaper about the congregation growing.

Drawer 1: St. James Catholic Church

St. James Catholic Church Folder 1 (1989-1994)

Description: Folder 1 contains articles about Father Cronk taking the lead over the church (1989) and the construction on the new building (1992). There is also an article about the church dedication and the picture of the new building (1993/1994).

Description: This folder only contains 1 document that lists the Charter Members (no date listed).
