Summary	Summary does not present main idea and is not written in own words. Many major details are missing. There is little sense that the writing is organized. Connections to Science and Society	Reaction to article very vague and lacks obvious critical thought; no written ideas presented; no connection to areas of science	Reaction to article provides some evidence of thought. Reader is unsure how the writer feels about topic and that ideas of writing belong to someone else; connects to one area of science but doesn't include explanation	Reaction to article shows thought and provides an idea of writer's position on the issue. Writer draws on some knowledge or experience, but it adds nothing to the topic; connects to at least one area of science and provides explanation	Reaction clearly shows critical analysis of article (including the pros and cons); the writer's position is clearly stated and has made ideas of writing his/her own; connects to several areas of science and provides detailed explanations.	
Critique	Your opinion about the content of the article is vaguely expressed. No examples were used, or vocabulary from the article.
